When I walk or kayak at Mantanzas Inlet ("the place of slaughters") I think about how they met their untimely end. Theirs is a story of a lost cause that bathes our heritage in North Florida. Would there still have been an English loyalist period in Florida? Under the more friendly French, might the Timucuans still survive? Would the French Revolution have spilled onto American shores? Would a state governed by French descendants have joined the Confederacy? These are the great questions that flow from the rich history of our beloved City.

It is altogether appropriate that four hundred and fifty years later we celebrate our French beginnings, though short-lived they were. Moreover, this is a moment when our citizens can learn more about what happened here so long ago. There is no other story of the establishment of America that is more interesting or dramatic.

Mr. Mayor, thank you for recognizing the French era as formative to our history and important to celebrate. I support you in this worthy remembrance of our Sesquiquadricentennial.
