Dear Mayor Brown,

I am writing in recognition of the 450th anniversary of the landing of Jean Ribault along the North Coast of Florida. I am proud to join you in commemorating the events which led to the establishment of the first French settlement in the present-day United States for the purpose of individual and religious freedom in what is now Jacksonville.

On May 1, 1562, Jean Ribault sailed into what we now call the St. Johns River and named it River May. Upon offering a prayer of thanksgiving for their safe arrival, Ribault and his men erected a column in honor of their King, Charles IX, thereby claiming the land for France. Now, Jacksonville shares a Sister City relationship with Nantes, France, where in 1598 King Henry IV issued the Edict of Nantes which granted the Huguenots substantial civil and economic rights in the predominantly Roman Catholic kingdom. This ended the "Wars of Religion" and promoted a more tolerant and inclusive society.

I am proud of our great city and excited to join in the celebration of May 1, 2012 being declared as Jean Ribault Day in Jacksonville.
