### RESCLUTION 34-938-279

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF DUVAL COUNTY, FLORIDA, HEREBY AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTUR OF FIRE AND RESCUE OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE NAVAL STATION, MAYPORT, FLORIDA, FOR MUTUAL AID FOR FIRE, RESCUE, EMERGENCY OR DISASTER ASSISTANCE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

# CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA AND

THE NAVAL STATION, MAYPORT, FLORIDA INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR MUTUAL AID FOR FIRE, RESCUE, EMERGENCY OR DISASTER ASSISTANCE

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 19\_\_\_ by and between the City of Jacksonville and the Commanding Officer, Naval Station, Mayport, Florida.

#### WITNESSETH:

MATEREAS, each of the parties hereto maintain equipment and personnal for the suppression of the fires within its own jurisdiction and areas, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to augment the fire protection available in their various establishments, districts, agencies and municipalities in the event of large fires or conflagrations, and

WHEREAS, the lands or districts of the parties hereto are adjacent or contiguous so that mutual assistance in a fire emergency is deemed feasible, and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Navy Department and of the municipalities or other districts and of their governing bodies to conclude such Agreements wherever practicable, and

WHEREAS, it is mutually deemed sound, desirable, practicable and beneficial for the parties to this Agreement to render assistance to one another in accordance with these terms:

#### THEREFORE BE IT AGREED THAT:

- 1. Wherever it is deemed advisable by the senior officer of a fire department belonging to a party to this Agreement, or by the senior officer or any such fire department actually present at any fire, to request fire fighting assistance under the terms of this Agreement, he is authorized to do so, and the senior officer on duty of the fire department receiving the request shall forthwith take the following actions:
- (a) Immediately determine if apparatus and personnel can be spared in response to call.
- (b) What apparatus and personnel might most effectively be dispatched.
- (c) Determine the exact mission to be assigned in accordance with the detailed plans and procedures or operation drawn in accordance with this Agreement by the technical heads of the fire departments involved.

(d) Forthwith dispatch such apparatus and personnel as, in the judgement of the senior officer receiving the call, should be sent with complete instructions as to the mission, in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

- 2. The randering of assistance under the terms of this Agreement shall not be mandatory, but the party receiving the request for assistance shall immediately inform the requesting service if assistance cannot be rendered.
- 3. The parties hereto waive all claims against every other party for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury, or death occurring in consequence of the performance of this Agreement.
- 4. All services performed under this Agreement shall be rendered without reimbursement of either party or parties, except that the City of Jacksonville shall be entitled to seek reimbursement pursuant to the section il of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2210) and Federal Regulations issued thereunder (Title 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations 2010) for all or any part of direct expenses and losses (additional fire fighting costs over and above normal operating costs) incurred in fighting fires on property under the jurisdiction of the United States.
- 5. The senior officer of the fire department of the requesting service shall assume full charge of the operations. Kowever, under procedures agreed to by the technical heads of the fire departments involved, a senior officer of the department furnishing the assistance may assume responsibility for the coordination of the overall operation.
- 6. The various officers and personnel of the fire departments of the parties to this Agreement are invited and encouraged, on a reciprocal basis, to frequently visit each other's activities for guided familiarization tours consistent with local security requirements and, as desirable, to jointly conduct prefire planning inspections, drills and training.
- 7. THIS AGREEMENT shall become effective upon the date hermof and shall remain in full force and effect until canceled by mutual Agreement of the parties hereto by written rotice by one party tot he other party with sixty (60) days notice of said cancellation.
