 are qualified to effectively perform their ARFF activities. JFRD shall maintain records of the
 training program. Medical Requirements shall be in accordance with NFPA 1003 and NFPA
 1582.
- On a not to interfere basis, participate in Boeing initiated emergency response or mishap drills.

OBLIGATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF BOEING

The Boeing Company shall agree and adhere to the following:

- The Boeing Company Cecil Field Aviation Safety Official (ASO) or his designated representative shall serve as the point of contact for administrating, monitoring and compliance. The ASO shall coordinate with ARFF supervisors to ensure compliance with governing Standards.
- Flight Operations are conducted on an as required basis and cannot be accurately predicted
 for planning purposes. Boeing will notify JFRD ARFF and Cecil Airport Air Traffic Control
 Tower of scheduled flight operations through distribution of a Daily Flight Schedule (Request
 for Flight Approval).
- Emergent flight operation requirements not included on the Daily Flight Schedule (Request for Flight Approval) shall be coordinated between the ASO or his designated representative and ARFF Supervisors.
- The Boeing Company shall provide semi-annual aircraft familiarization training to ARFF
 personnel for aircraft currently under contract at The Boeing Company Cecil Field. This
 training shall also include aircrew rescue and extraction.

- The Boeing Company shall give JFRD the ability to train newly assigned ARFF firefighters
 using approved Boeing training material and onsite resources until they can be officially
 trained by Boeing personnel during the semi-annual aircraft familiarization training. JFRD
 will notify Boeing when these new firefighters are assigned and trained.
- Boeing shall use the Cecil Airport Emergency Action Plan to the maximum extent possible for responding to incidents or emergencies.

<u>COOPERATION BETWEEN PARTIES</u>: Is to provide professional ARFF services for the safety of personnel, Cecil Airport and The Boeing Company property and the property of contracting Government Agencies. Each party shall exercise its respective role and responsibilities and endeavor to cooperate with all other parties to the maximum extent practicable whenever coordination efforts are necessary or desirable.

PAYMENT FOR SERVICES:

- JFRD will bill The Boeing Company quarterly. Payment will continue through quarterly
 invoicing and JFRD would receive payment through the No-Purchase Order Payment system
 in accordance to written communications received from The Boeing Company Supplier
 Management The Boeing Company Cecil Field Senior Operations Support Manager.
- This arrangement is a standard cost (no differentiation from quarter to quarter) to perform flight operations anytime without the need to pre-schedule JFRD ARFF protection.
- Semi-Annual Egress Training is included in the aforementioned cost.
