**Toast Masters:** An international organization that helps you improve your speaking and communication skills and Leadership skills

- In Latino community if you do not articulate well, sometimes it's disrespected, and it comes across as if you lack intelligence
- Social Stereotype if you don't speak English very well, you must not be very intelligent
- About 200 clubs in the Jacksonville area



- A safe environment that allows people to practice, improve and build confidence where when you own your own business it'll give the credibility you need
- Toast Masters over 100yrs old, 5013c, headquartered in CA, recently moved to Colorado has over 270k members worldwide
- Once you're Toast Masters, you're a family, it is an organization that helps each other
- Southside Multicultural Club (Maribel's Club), we focus on people who where English is not their first language, but we also have members where English is their first language
- Meet twice a month, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesdays, 6:30pm 8:30pm at <sup>1</sup>Holy Rosery Catholic Church on Baymeadows & Southside Blvd
- Membership funds (\$10/month) go directly into Toast Masters
- 3 main parts to meetings:
  - Prepared speeches
  - Feedback (on the prepared speeches)
  - Table Topics where you have 1-2 minutes to answer a question (you don't know what question they are going to ask)
- Encouraging people to look for a club to join or visit and see if it works for you

Pablo Diaz De Sandi gave recognition to Maribel Hernandez for everything she does in the Public Service Grants area, states she is a huge advocate in the Hispanic community

   Guest Presentation: Samari Franco, Florida Guardian Ad Litem Office –
   A state agency that represents children from within court and the communities
  - Recruiting for volunteers, mentors, and Pro Bono Attorney's
  - Join our multi-disciplinary team which includes:
    - A child welfare professional
    - A volunteer from within the community
      - visit the child once a month at their foster home
      - find out the child's needs
      - Every 2-3 months, advocate for those needs in court
    - An attorney in the Florida Guardian office
  - Everyone will be collaborating to represent the child
  - Mentorship initiative -
    - No court
    - Paired with a youth over the age of 15
    - Help that youth transition over into adulthood
  - Information sessions via zoom monthly,
  - Interested contact Samari Franco for registration link
  - Over 14,000 children (over 49% are males) that belong to the agency, approximately 500 active volunteers
  - Currently partnering with law enforcement and fire rescue

Question by Carmen Martinez: what kind of screening do you do for the volunteers and mentors



Answer: we do level 2 background checks and face to face interview, vetting process

  - Lots of vendors & family friendly activities:
    - Bounce Houses, Rock Wall, Water Slides, face painting, food, music (DJ), etc.
    - About 200 people attended, about 60% Hispanic
    - Great coverage from All That News
    - Distributed a lot of Narcan & diapers
  - o UF Health Event hosted by Inspire to Rise
    - Hispanic Focus material child health
    - Focus on toxic stress
    - Postpartum depression
    - Only about 20 people, completely in Spanish
    - House of Representatives reached out to Inspire to Rise for us to host a Baby Shower/Block Party Event, so in the planning process for that, coming soon
    - Annual Back to School Event coming
      - 600 people last year
      - Lots of vendors
      - Rock Walk this year and Dunk Tank
      - August 2<sup>nd</sup>
      - Miller Electric reached out to sponsor
      - Expecting 6-700 this year
      - Need volunteers

- 3 main purposes as a Board for the Mayor & Hispanic Community
  - Act as a liaison between the city government and the mayor
  - Report to the mayor anytime with necessary findings or accommodations
  - encourage & solicit corporation in entities to develop and assist the Hispanic community
- will have a draft letter to the mayor by next meeting of what we as a Board are hearing from the Hispanic community:
  - Temporary protected status is being eliminated for some people
  - People are scared whether they're here illegally or not of the authorities and ICE coming to their door and knocking it down and dragging them out
  - Being discriminated against by how they look or where they're standing outside of Home Depot or Lowes and being targeted by how they speak and whether they (we) have an accent
    - There's a lot of things being moved in government and laws that are progressing through the state legislators and locally
    - We will review and vote on letter before sending it to the mayor

Comment by Arlene: states very sad who is reporting, sometimes it's the same Hispanic people, if you have a business, sometimes the competition will call and accuse the other person
