



Timeline of Service




Over 800 teens participated in 10 programs




- This analysis focuses on the 858 teens that were
 - served between July 2016 and June 2017, and were
 - able to be matched to DCPS data.
- During analysis, some youth under 13 were identified. Funding will not be provided for these youth.

Demographics of Participants



- With Girl Scouts included, 60.5% of total participants are female
- 70% of participants are eligible for free or reduced lunch





Girl Scouts	270	12,146	55	1 session (1.5 hrs)
YMCA	122	6,314	63	1 day
Boys & Girls Club	217	1,974	11	1 day
Dont Miss A Beat	36	3,981	113	1 day
PAL	26	349	28	varies

- Programs have varying definitions of a unit of service (UOS)
- Average units per student show that dosage varies significantly by program


Outcomes: School Attendance

Change in Attendance from 2015-2016 to 2016-2017



- On average, teen participants had 6.0 absences in 2015-2016 and 8.2 absences in 2016-2017
- 42.4% of teens maintained or improved their attendance in 2016-2017
- Program participants, on average, had about one less absence than a comparative group of non-participants


Outcomes: Conduct Referrals by Program



- In 2016-2017 teen participants had, on average, 0.8 minor referrals, 0.5 intermediate referrals and 0.04 major referrals.
- Average total referrals per student varied by program from 0 for KIPP to 2.7 for Wayman.

Outcomes: Conduct referrals year-on-year

Change in Referrals from 2015-2016 to 2016-2017



- Count of total referrals at all levels of severity was compared from 2015-2016 to 2016-2017
- Count of referrals was maintained or decreased for 29% of the participants
- Boys & Girls Club participants showed the greatest improvement year-on-year, with a decrease of 0.6 referrals on average

Recommendations

- Standardize the unit of service to 1 hour to allow for dosage analysis
- Consider funding male-focused programs to address gender imbalance
- Incorporate DJJ data to evaluate juvenile justice involvement for teens
