
JOURNEY-FUNDED SUMMER CAMPS

- 73 Summer Camps
- No Universal Focused Curriculum
- 5 or 6 weeks
- 4,890 Seats Proposed
- 5,695 Students
 Attended at least one day





SAIL Network Program Engagement


Engagement was significantly higher at Normandy Village and Sallye B. Mathis Sail Network Summer Camps.

At Arlington Elementary, 20 participants (12.4%) attended 1 week of camp or less.

At Reynolds Lane Elementary, 25 participants (18.5%) attended 1 week of camp of less.



Engagement by Site




No Journey-funded site had an average engagement higher than 90%

3 (25%) site had an average engagement between 80 and 90%


9 (75%) site had an average engagement of less than 80%

Engagement on Field Trip Days



- There is no significant difference between attendance on Field Trip Days versus non-Field Trip Days for the Jax Journeyfunded summer camps.
 - This lack of difference is consistent across camps, however the number of days labelled as field trips is not consistent.
 - 6 camps have no data for one of the field trip themes
 - No data to indicate whether the trip took place
 - Some camps took as many as 3 days for a single theme's field trip.

Engagement on Field Trip Days



- The Week 1 field trip appears to have the highest attendance.
 - Three groups missed this field trip, all of whom have lower than average attendance.
 - The middle two field trips maintained average attendance, while the final week of field trips saw a large decrease in attendance.
