Program Strategy: The overall and continuing strategy for the early learning component of the Jacksonville Journey program is to encourage families to engage in early learning experiences with their children who are 0-5 years of age.		
Summary of Program: ELC of Duval will provide scholarships to parents for at least 125 School Readiness (SR) children who already attend a Guiding Stars of Duval child care center. Guiding Stars of Duval (GSOD) is the voluntary quality rating improvement system that ELC of Duval uses to determine the level of quality offered at centers. Participating Journey child care centers must have a rating of 3, 4, or 5 stars and be in a 1.5 mile radius of the HUD anchor complexes identified by the Jacksonville Journey Oversight Committee. Participating child care centers will receive additional funding based on their current star level and meeting the required benchmarks to improve the quality of their program. Parents will be given an opportunity to attend the selected centers at no cost to them. The amount of the scholarship for the parent will be based on the age of the SR child.		
Program Overall Status: The following tasks have been completed for the month of July: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Help Me Grow Northeast Florida, funded by United Way of Northeast Florida, presented program information to the residents of Cleveland Arms. Individual screenings were also conducted with the children. Resources were distributed and results of the screenings were given the next week to the parents as a follow up. • Family Foundations presented information to the parents during lunchtime at Washington Heights regarding their 1000 in 1000 program. One on one counseling about the application process was also offered.
