RULES FOR OPEN BURNING

- 1. Only land clearing debris resulting from the initial clearing of vegetation on the property may be burned. The burning of household, yard and construction material or waste is illegal.
- 2. Wind and humidity must not create a fire or pollution hazard.
- 3. You must call 255-7100 daily (Monday through Friday), prior to igniting the burn, and confirm permission for the burn. You must call 255-7100 before 3:00 P.M. on Friday (or the last workday of the week) to be put on the Weekend Burn List. For weekend and holiday burning, call 255-7190 each morning between 8:00 and 9:00 A.M., prior to igniting the burn, and confirm permission for the burn.
- 4. Open burning may be conducted from 9:00 a.m. to one hour before sunset. You are required to fully extinguish (the absence of any visible flames, smoke or emissions) the fire prior to sunset.
- 5. Excessive smoke is not allowed except for a 30-minute start-up and extinguishment period.
- 6. Setback requirements when burning material cleared on site:
 - a. 100 feet from any public road and the prevailing winds direct the smoke away from the public road
 - b. 1,000 feet from the nearest occupied building.
 - c. 300 feet from the nearest occupied building for a single lot residential land clearing burn.
 - d. 300 feet from the nearest occupied building if an air curtain incinerator is used.
 - e. 100 ft from any wildlands, brush or combustible structure.*
 - f. 50 ft from any wildlands, brush or combustible structure for a single lot residential land clearing burn.*
 - g. 50 ft from any wildlands, brush or combustible structure if an air curtain incinerator is used.*
- 7. Open burning which reduces visibility on public roadways to less than one thousand (1,000) feet is prohibited.
- 8. Burning of land clearing debris is restricted to the site where the material was generated and may not be transported to another site to be burned, except with a Temporary Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (TCON) issued pursuant to Chapter 380, City Code
- 9. Setback requirements when material to be burned is hauled in from another location:
 - a. 100 feet from any public road.
 - b. 300 feet from occupied buildings for an air curtain incinerator with vertical refractory-lined walls and forced under-draft air.
 - c. 1,000 feet from occupied buildings for all air curtain incinerators.
- 10. The fire must always be attended by a person with the proper equipment to control and extinguish the fire. A copy of the permit must be posted at the site of the burning for the entire time the burning takes place and shall be clearly visible from adjacent roads.
- 11. You must respond to after-hours calls to complete the extinguishment of your fire.
- 12. Violations of any conditions of this permit, EPB Rule 2 or Chapter 360, Part 8, may be subject to enforcement and civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per day, per violation.
- 13. Open burning is regulated by EPB rule 2.801 and Chapter 360, City Code.
- 14. An Air Pollution Permit is needed if an Air Curtain Incinerator is on one site longer than six (6) months.
