WHEREAS, the allocation of Chapter Funds and the authorization for the Bonus Payment is governed by provisions reflected in that certain Restated Agreement Between the City of Jacksonville and the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees (the "Restated Agreement"), as amended; and

WHEREAS, recent growth in the level of Chapter Funds collections may allow for the consideration of supplemental programs of Enhanced Benefits to be funded solely from residual Chapter Funds; and

WHEREAS, on February 27, 2004, Mayor Peyton endorsed a concept (the "Peyton Plan") that would have provided for the payment of certain post-retirement enhancements from residual Chapter Funds in conjunction with the consideration of Ordinance 2003-1338-E; and

WHEREAS, for a variety of reasons, Ordinance 2003-1338-E, as enacted, did not contain the Peyton Plan; and

WHEREAS, a revised approach to the Peyton Plan has been developed in an effort to more specifically describe the nature of the post-retirement enhancement that would be funded solely from such residual Chapter Funds; and

WHEREAS, the revised approach authorizes a discretionary, one-time bonus payment to be paid in the first payroll in December of even numbered years, provided that sufficient residual Chapter Funds are available to fund the entire cost of the same, so as to provide the possibility for a discretionary, one-time bonus payment to be paid in December of every calendar year; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Execute and Implement. There is hereby approved and the Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are authorized to (1) execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City of Jacksonville, a Third Amendment to the Restated Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and (2) take, or cause to be taken, for and on behalf of the City of Jacksonville, such further action to effectuate the purpose of this ordinance.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor of upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.

Bill Summary: This bill approves a Third Amendment to the Restated Agreement Between the City of Jacksonville and the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees. The Mayor, or designee, and Corporation Secretary are authorized to execute said amendment and to take further action to effectuate the purposes of this ordinance.

Background Information: Certain chapters of Florida Statutes provide for distribution to police and fire pension plans throughout Florida of certain funds which originate from the collection of premiums on casualty insurance policies. In Jacksonville, funds are used to provide for a defined, base level of pension benefits, with any residual funds being available to support programs of enhanced benefits. This Third Amendment changes the current biennial retiree bonus to an annually-based retiree bonus. It provides for a discretionary, annual retiree bonus, if authorized by the Board and provided that sufficient funds are then available in the Enhanced Benefit Account to fund the entire cost. The discretionary annual retiree bonus is to be in an amount up to, but not exceeding, 3% of the pension base amount of the retiree or surviving spouse. Information from the Police and Fire Pension Fund states that this will incur no additional cost to the City or Members contribution rate, as the plan can be accommodated by current balances and future revenues accruing to the Enhanced Benefit Account. Additionally, the statement from Pension Board Consultants, Inc., indicates that this amendment does not increase plan costs and has no actuarial impact.
