Call for Public Speakers (online & card): a) John Nooney - (Public Speaker) Expressed his concerns regarding his trespass citation on Jacksonville University property (seeking pardon), and river access. Continues to

lobby for the purchase of his property by Potsburg Creek.
b) Will Tuten - (Public Speaker) UNF Student, expresses
appreciation for upcoming tree plans on campus and the
trees around the city. Is requesting the inclusion of

Southern Hackberry (SugarBerry) providing shade, edible fruit and habitat for wildlife.

Request for action/follow-up- Hart to Gearhart: To put the consideration of including the species on the approved species list onto an upcoming Tree Commission agenda.

Action Items:

Issue: The minutes from March 19, 2025, deferred to next regular meeting.

2. Level 3 Project Proposal

A. <u>UNF- John November, Sarah Dark</u>: UNF project presentation (please see presentation documents)

Designed by UNF staff in coordination with City, with the philosophy of "right tree, right place." All planting is on UNF property. Plans consider street sight lines, heat zones (need for shade), fruit species are away from sidewalks (fruits would fall upon grass). Maintenance is UNF/State, because the property is not City, with little exception. Updated plant schedule and tree sizes provided. Project is noted for diversity in tree selection, placement, and planning related to maintenance.

Fraser: <u>Point of Inquiry</u> - requested explanation / plan for maintenance of fruit trees. Presenter: The fruit trees are near dorms and near student activity related to gardening.

Fraser: <u>Point of Inquiry</u> - requested a breakdown of estimate.

Presenter: explained that the "not to exceed" cost estimates are the equivalent of what is listed in other Level 3 Projects as "contingency" [**Gearhart** agreed that usually Level 3 Projects include 10% for "what ifs".]

Fraser: <u>Point of Inquiry</u> - if the costs of plant material exceed project funding the group will come back to Tree Commission?

Gearhart: the project cannot be altered to make up for costs (can't remove trees from the plan).

Tracy Arpen: <u>Point of Information</u> - non-profits take a risk on cost of work and planning (hourly compensation for staff time).

Hart: Point of Information - Raised the issue of if costs exceed approved amount and Tree Commission increases the amount, that may affect the City Council approval process as an Exceptional Planting Project.

David Hoyt: <u>UNF Student</u> expressed appreciation of the shade provided by trees around the parking lot and the addition of new trees moving forward.

Katherine Harlamor: <u>UNF Student</u> commented on future plantings at university entrance, housing areas, not sure about fruit trees, and appreciates program to bring more shade trees.

Total requested amount: \$367,000 Staff note: Sec. 94.107, Ordinance Code, applies.

a. Combined revenues: Combined Revenues for Fiscal YTD are \$3.78M compared to \$2.88M Mar-24. An increase of \$906.SK year-on-year. Combined Expenses for Fiscal YTD are \$1.92M compared to \$3.17M on Mar-24. A decrease of \$1.25M yearon-year. Combined Revenues for Mar-25 were \$1 M compared to \$598.6K for Mar-24, an increase of \$404.SK. Meanwhile, expenses were \$229.7K and \$407.SK on Mar-25 and Mar-24, respectively. Total unallocated funds were \$24.1 for Mar-25.

A. Taskforce Update- Fraser: Susan Fraser and Jon Colburn had a call with James Urban to discuss details and updates to planting methods. Fraser announced that she expects a big update and there will be a conclusion. Details and results from the Taskforce are being organized for presentation.

8. New Business

A. Money For Appropriations: Gearhart: Overview of past projects and allocations regarding appropriations. Gearhart presented financial details of the past two years and breakdown to support previous funding request for single year funding.

Discussion: of current funds and how they are being utilized. The remaining funds will last about 1 month. Details of how funds are being distributed between charter and ordinance funds were discussed.

Gearhart explains the complexity of planting trees due to limitations in use of funds due to utilities, site complications, and tree compliance. Commented that he has increased the use of Charter Funds for Remove and Replace. He systematically line-items Ordinance Fund spending versus Charter Fund spending, as required. He noted that "remove" comes from Ordinance Fund, but the replace aspect may come from either fund depending on the species of tree. **Fraser:** requests Parks department work to spend these funds.

Total requested amount: \$2,100,000 from Ordinance Fund to Remove and Replace as a 1-year amount.
