5. Financial Report for Ordinance Tree Fund (15304), Charter Tree Fund (15305) and BJP (Attachment D) - Jose Regueiro

- 1. Combined Revenues for Fiscal YTD are \$6.7 compared to \$5.03M July-24. An increase of \$1.67M year-on-year.
- 2. Combined Expenses for Fiscal YTD are \$2.8M compared to \$5.16M on July-24. A decrease of \$2.36M year-on-year.
- 3. Combined Revenues for Aug-25 were \$639K compared to \$679K for July-24, a decrease of \$39.5K. Meanwhile, expenses were \$150.8K and \$333.6K on July-25 and July-24, respectively.
- 4. Total unallocated funds were \$25M for July-25.

6. Fund Status of 630-CITY, Remove & Replace and Level 2 Programs (Attachment E) - Justin Gearhart

Total funds not appropriated at \$34.71M. Remaining in the four pools \$9.77M (R and R 3.01M; 630-City \$2.01M; Level 2 \$2.28M; and Level 3 \$2.47M).

i. SPAR 2025 Project Canopy

A tree planting project has been requested for planting in the Right of Ways in the Springfield Preservation and Revitalization district. This project will take place in City Council District 7 and includes the planting of a variety of trees that will enhance walkability and the aesthetic character of the district. It will reduce the heat island effect, and will filter and slow down stormwater runoff before reaching the city's stormwater management infrastructure. This project includes the planting of 279 (280) total trees, with no tree removals necessary.
