<p>During the month of November, a total of 27 ex-offender students participated in vocational training and received supportive services. 8 graduates became employed. No students or graduates were re-arrested. 5 students left the program during the month.</p> <p>Students continued to meet with case managers to assess progress on Individual Service Plans, and also met with the mental health counselor. Students received random drug screens during the month. Life Skills curriculum for October included Adult Literacy, Math, thinking 4 A Change (re-entry curriculum), HIV education, Anger Management and Employability. Ongoing supportive services include: Meals, Housing Placement Assistance, Transportation, and Referral Services, including linkages to mainstream and other resources, as indicated and/or requested. All employed graduates received follow up services.</p> <p style="text-align:center"><b>Program Overall Status:</b></p> <p><b>Successes:</b> A total of 27 ex-offenders participated in vocational training during the month. 8 ex-offender graduates became employed during the month. Recidivism rate was 0% for the current classes.</p> <p><b>Challenges:</b> No significant challenges.</p>
