Construction delays caused by various unforeseen conditions has extended the completion date on the Coastline Drive and Liberty Street Bridge Replacement project. Continued design, geolechnical oversight and CEI services are needed through construction completion to comply with the contract's RFP requirements. Negotiations with GAI Consultants, Inc. have resulted in the attached Scope of Services, Exhibit I and Fee Summary Exhibit J. There is no rate increase associated with this amendment. #### **GENERAL**

The Coastline Drive and Liberty Street Bridge Replacement Project is a Design-Build Project being undertaken by the City of Jacksonville in partnership with the Florida Department of Transportation under a Local Agency Program (LAP) for the complete demolition of the Courthouse parking deck, and reconstruction of Coastline Drive Bridge and the Liberty Street Bridge. GAI Consultants, Inc. and supporting Sub-Consultant services provided by Meskel & Associates Engineering, Inc. (JSEB), C&ES, Inc. (JSEB) and Thomas Diving, collectively known as GAI will be providing Construction Engineering and Inspection Services for this project. The CEI Scope of Services outlined under Section 4.0 of the RFP # P-37-16 will be performed by GAI Consultants, for the City of Jacksonville, also referenced as "City" under the contract for P-37-16.

GAI will provide onsite construction inspection, management and administrative services to verify the quality and quantity of work, but will not override the contractor's means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures of the construction selected by the contractor(s) or the safety-precautions and programs incidental to the work of the contractor(s). GAI's efforts will also be directed toward assisting in the interpretation of the prepared drawings and specifications, shop drawing review, assistance in the resolution of field problems or questions, and determining whether the completed project will conform to the contract documents GAI will continually verify the project is compliance with the procedures outlined in the LAP Agreement between FDOT and the City and the project's overall compliance with the contract documents.

#### **INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS**

The scope of the inspection for the remaining work includes, but is not limited to the following: maintenance of traffic; control and abatement of erosion and water pollution; parking deck demolition; grading, excavation and embankment, construction of roadway widening along Courthouse Drive, driving of over 110, 24-inch prestressed concrete piles for both Coastline Drive and Liberty Street bridges, reinforced steel, concrete deck pours, barrier wall pours, signing and pavement markings and other incidental construction. Verification of the submerged bridge foundations will be verified utilizing certified divers and inspection logs reviewed by their Principal. All required certifications will be maintained by onsite personnel as outlined in the City's RFP's Scope of Services Section 4.0.

Scope of Services Cont'd August 12, 2020 Page 2

#### ADMINISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

GAI shall oversee the daily administration of the contract, which includes but is not limited to verifying Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO Compliance by documenting daily work efforts including contractors personnel, conduction routine employee interviews, submitting interviews to FDOT, reviewing and verifying all materials meet the contract requirements, reviewing plan revisions for constructability and overall compliance with the Design-Build RFP and applicable contract documents, data entry into FDOT's MAC program for samples taken, verifying contractor's quality control test results, resolving FDOT's monthly comments concerning in MAC sample results.

Other activities include verifying pile driving activities by reviewing the pile driving logs, dry run logs and concrete depths for bridge deck pours, entering required documents in FDOT's LAPIT. Meskel Engineering will perform verification lab related material verification testing. GAI will monitor all RFIs, RFCs and RFMs, coordinate with the City, provide monthly aerials to document progress, verify key survey data and as-built bridge elevations, review change orders and assist the City in any Dispute Resolution meetings and contractor's request for equitable payment for additional work. GAI will also facilitate bi-weekly progress meetings and pre-work meetings. GAI will also assist in coordinating with adjacent projects and affected third parties while resolving onsite issues with the contractor's daily operations.

GAI shall review the contractor's monthly CPM Schedule for overall compliance and forward a copy to the City.

NPDES Inspections — Immediately following each rainfall event of ½" or greater, the inspector will visit the site, inspect all erosion/sedimentation control measures, direct the contractor to repair or replace damaged erosion/sedimentation controls and verify that the required work is done in accordance with the NPDES/permit requirements.

<u>Authority</u> – The City gives GAI the authority to require the contractor to correct all work not in compliance with the approved plans and/or City requirements. If the contractor refuses or fails to take the required corrective action, GAI shall immediately notify the City.

Testing – GAI's qualified field representatives will be responsible for selecting locations for verification of concrete plastic and compressive strength, compaction and density testing and verifying that all required Contractor's Quality Control testing is performed in accordance with City's requirements/specifications for locations and frequency. Field verification samples will be collected by GAI. Laboratory Verification Samples will be tested by Meskel at an accredited lab and by qualified personnel, as required to meet the LAP requirements. Random samples will be collected for all materials outlined in FDOT's Material Acquisition and Certification program and submitted to the FDOT's State Materials Office (SMO) as required.

Scope of Services Cont'd August 12, 2020 Page 3

The construction contractor is expected to provide his own quality assurance testing and will be independent of the services provided herein.

All inspection and testing requirements shall apply at all times while construction operations are being performed including weekends and holidays.

<u>Inspector Logs</u> – GAI and its subconsultants' onsite inspector shall maintain an inspection log throughout the duration of construction. This log shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Location and description of construction operations taking place at time of site visit
- Specific information regarding inspection/acceptance of project materials
- Information on construction problems and directions given to the contractor to resolve the problems
- · Summaries of contractor's personnel and equipment

On days where there is no construction or no construction requiring inspection, the daily log should note either that there was no activity or list the operations that were taking place (per the contractor) and state "No inspection required". Copies of the Inspector Log shall be uploaded into LAPIT. A copy of all documents will be provided to the City.

Shop drawings – Upon receipt of shop drawing from the contractor, GAI shall forward the Contract's shop drawing review for each component requiring shop drawings. GAI shall coordinate with the Engineer of Record in the shop drawing review process. GAI will coordinate the review and strive to return shop drawings within the allowable timeframe or less to the contractor. Final approved shop drawings shall be submitted to the City to be RFC'ed after all comments are resolved.

<u>As-builts</u> – GAI shall review as-builts drawings. Drawings that do not meet the requirements outlined in the Contract Documents will be returned to the Contractor for correction. Final as-built drawings shall be submitted to the City for concurrence and acceptance.

<u>Contractor Pay Requests and Change Orders</u> – GAI's staff will assist the City's Project Manager as-needed with evaluating the contractor's pay request. GAI will assist the City's Project Manager as necessary in processing of the pay request and processing of all City-approved Contractor change order requests on the project.

<u>Substantial Completion</u> – The City shall be notified in advance of the substantial completion inspection to allow the City's various Departments time to make arrangements to participate.

Following the Substantial Completion inspection, a copy of the punch list of items to be completed along with a list of the persons attending the inspection shall be e-mailed to each of the above agencies.

Scope of Services Cont'd August 12, 2020 Page 4

<u>Final Documentation</u> – Prior to the City's acceptance of the project, GAI will turn over the following documents:

- Original Inspector's Logs
- All test reports for the project (including those tests that failed and were retested)
- All approved shop drawings
- Certification stating that the materials and construction that were inspected by the GAI's qualified individual, that all inspection services were provided as outlined in the scope of services, that construction has been completed in substantial conformance with the approved plans, and that the as-built drawings have been reviewed and meet the City's requirements. This certification is to be signed and sealed by GAI's Senior Project Engineer based upon the scope of the services.

#### Schedule

GAI will provide, as needed, the above described services during construction, and closeout of the project. As of August 2020, substantial completion for the construction contract is currently estimated to be September 2020 with Final Completion by October 2020.

No additional compensation will be provided by GAI in the event the construction goes beyond October 2020 date unless authorized by the City.

#### Method of Compensation

Payment will be made in accordance with the City's original contract. No changes will be made to the original contract and terms of payment unless mutually agreed to by the City and GAI.

#### **Exclusions from Scope of Service**

The Contractor shall be responsible for his Quality Control Inspection efforts required by the construction contract.

#### **Additional Services**

Additional services may be added to this contract during the course of work based on negotiated fees. These respective fees shall be determined jointly by the City's staff and GAI. No work shall be undertaken on any additional service tasks without the written authorization of the City.

Please take appropriate action to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the referenced professional services.

The following information is furnished in accordance with chapter 126.302 of the City Ordinance Code.

1. The general purpose of the service or study:

It is the desire of the DIA and the City to design and ultimately construct a world-class Riverfront Plaza on that City-owned riverfront property formerly housing the Jacksonville Landing. To that end, the DIA, with guidance from the Procurement Division, has developed a Request for Proposal ("RFP") to select three (3) Design Firms and their consultants to compete in a Design Competition for the development of a vibrant and iconic public space on the premier waterfront site in Downtown Jacksonville, Florida. The City's selection process under this RFP will be performed in two separate phases: Phase I, Qualifications and shortlisting and Phase II, Design Competition of the shortlisted firms and final selection. The City intends to hire a complete Artist, Landscape Architect, Urban Designer, Architectural Team ("Design Team", made up of the "Design Firm" which is the Firm, Contractor or Consultant and leads the team together with the identified and evaluated subconsultant team members) to provide the professional design services.

Phase I will select three (3) Design Teams to participate in Phase II. The Phase II shortlisted Design Teams will receive stipends for the development of 50% plans.

#### 2. The Objective of the study or services:

#### The broad objectives, by Phase, are to:

Phase I: Is the selection of the three (3) most qualified Design Teams. The Upon the selection of the three (3) most qualified firms pursuant to Phase I, each firm will be provided a stipend of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to one hundred twenty-five thousand (\$125,000) to complete fifty percent (50%) design drawings for the Riverfront Plaza. Note: The exact amount of the stipend will be provided to the Procurement Department prior to the meeting of the Professional Services Evaluation Committee. Further, each firm and their team must be comprised, at a minimum, of a Landscape Architect (presumably the firm or team lead), an Artist, an Urban Designer/Architect, and at least one (1) firm or team member with experience in park programming, place-making and public space activation. Note: A more detailed description of qualifications, experience and deliverables is attached hereto.

Note: The City will provide survey and geotechnical data for the site to the Shorlisted Qualified Design Teams as selected in Phase I, along with a detailed competition scope.

Phase II: The deliverables of Phase II to be provided by each of the Shortlisted Qualified Design Teams will include a detailed site plan, renderings including all public buildings or structures as well as all hardscape and landscape park features, a probable cost estimate, identification of intended programming of each space and images, renderings including views from the river, aerial, on site, and views of the river from Laura Street, preliminary design of the art piece(s); landscape design including integration of the art into site design, and a narrative explanation of how the design is representative of Jacksonville and its unique attributes and residents. An oral presentation will be made by each Design Team in a public workshop. Thereafter, the Professional Services and Evaluation Committee, after consultation with Subject Matter Experts, will select one (1) firm from the three (3) firms selected for Phase I to be engaged to proceed to 100% engineering drawings.

The estimated period of time needed for the service or study:

It is anticipated that by March 25<sup>th</sup> a shortlist of three (3) design firms/teams will be presented to PSEC. It is anticipated that Phase II will take approximately ten (10) weeks, with selection of a single firm to proceed to final

design within a month following that 10 week period. It is further anticipated that on or by September 30<sup>th</sup> final deliverables will be due.

4. The estimated cost of the service or study:

Phase II stipends per firm will be between \$100,000 and \$125,000, with the final stipend amount to be provided prior to the meeting of the Professional Services Evaluation Committee. Final design costs will be negotiated.
