AMENDMENT NO. 10 NEWTOWN DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS – MCCOYS CREEK MODEL UPDATES

This Authorization, when executed, shall be incorporated in and become part of the Agreement for Professional Services between the City of Jacksonville (CITY), and CDM Smith Inc. (ENGINEER), dated June 23, 2017 hereafter referred to as the Contract.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The CITY conducted a major update to their 1992 Master Stormwater Management Plan (MSMP) in 2011 and updated the tributary stormwater models in 2013. Since that time, the CITY has continued to develop and implement capital improvement projects. The 1992 and 2011 MSMP documents considered combined rainfall and tidal flooding to most accurately define flooding and solutions. The current contract includes services related to update, refinement, and maintenance of the CITY's MSMP.

Since the 2013 update, the CITY has provided support to Jacksonville consultants, contractors, developers, and surveyors by distributing MSMP information and providing interpretation of MSMP data. As the CITY's Stormwater consultant, ENGINEER has become the keeper of this data and routinely provides access to the data as directed by the CITY.

Original Contract—The contract included development of a design criteria package and a grant application for the Doeboy Regional Stormwater Facility.

Amendment No. 1 – Amendment No. 1 includes preliminary design services related to development of stormwater treatment facilities for the Arlington area. The amendment includes modifying the existing stormwater model to include the proposed facility, quantifying water quality and quantity impacts, and preparing a cost estimate.

Amendment No. 2 – Amendment No. 2 includes services to maintain the MSMP data sets and models and distribute them to third parties at the CITY's direction on an as-requested basis.

Amendment No. 3 - Amendment No. 3 extended the contract timeline to June 21, 2021

Amendment No. 4 – Amendment No. 4 includes support for the City Community Rating System (CRS) 5-year audit and recertification.

Amendment No. 5 – Amendment No. 5 includes services to provide SWMM modeling services and interpretation of results in response to requests from the CITY for alternative analysis.



Amendment No. 6 – Amendment No. 6 revalidates the stormwater utility rate and documents the methodology in a technical memorandum.

Amendment No.7 – Amendment No. 7 reviews the countywide list of MSMP projects and updates project information based on 1) re-prioritization of the CITY's level of service goals for flood control, water quality, and operation and maintenance, 2) updates estimated project costs based on CPI index, 3) determines ability of the proposed project to be implemented based on current land availability.

Amendment No. 8 – Amendment No. 8 includes support to complete annual recertification reporting for the City's Community Rating System.

- Jacksonville Transportation Authority (JTA) campus stormwater infrastructure including a
 72-inch box culvert.
- Lined 36-inch diameter stormwater pipe through the "Brickyard Area"
- Newtown neighborhood proposed drainage structure improvements

ENGINEER will model the mean annual, 5-, 10-, 25-, and 100-yr 24-hour design storms using SWMM 5.1.013 and document existing water surface elevations. ENGINEER will incrementally increase the size of the 36-inch diameter pipe through the "Brickyard Area" to increase conveyance and document impacts to the downstream stages in the mainstem of McCoy's Creek.

ENGINEER will perform project administrative activities including project set-up, internal management/administration, internal coordination, internal and client communication, status/schedule update, and final closeout.

These activities will help keep the project on schedule, allow updates and communication with the CITY to take place on a continuous basis, and allow potential scope, budget, or schedule creep to be identified early and addressed immediately. ENGINEER will prepare monthly invoices by task for work completed on this project and submit to the CITY.

BASIS OF ESTIMATE

The following have been used to develop this Amendment and the associated budget:

- Collection of survey information is not included in this Amendment.
- CITY or CITY's consultant will provide survey and as-built information to ENGINEER for incorporation into the model.
- CITY or CITY's consultant will provide topography and drainage divide information for area to be added to the model.
- The base model for the project is the Scenario 3.3 model of the McCoy's Creek Restoration Project.

SCOPE OF SERVICES July 19, 2021

PROFESSIONAL DESIGN SERVICES FOR PENMAN ROAD COMPLETE STREETS RFP NO. P-11-20 CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA

A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- The intent of this project is to provide a Study and Conceptual Plan Sheets for proposed Complete Streets Project for Penman Road from Beach Boulevard to Atlantic Boulevard in Duval County.
- 2. The project length is approximately 2.5 miles.
- 3. The scope of this project is based on recommendations included in the Request for Proposals (RFP) P-11-20 for Professional Engineering Services for Penman Road Complete Streets Project from Beach Boulevard to Atlantic Boulevard dated April 2020. Information to be included:
 - a. An analysis of alternative roadway typical sections including selection of a recommended typical section. The recommended typical section will accommodate all users of the corridor including motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians (Complete Streets approach). A typical section exhibit will be included.
 - b. Temporary Traffic Control concepts to adequately address movements of corridor users during construction.
 - c. Conceptual Plan Sheets (aerial based) indicating the recommended typical section option including roadway and sidewalk pavement limits and proposed signing and pavement marking and signal requirements.
 - d. A discussion of the drainage design requirements for the recommended alternative roadway typical section and other improvements. This will include a schematic layout of the drainage systems required (no actual modeling required) and provide a writeup to be included in the Study describing basins and proposed systems. Also, preliminary drainage maps to depict of flow directions will be created on provided base maps.
 - e. A discussion of the existing utilities located within the project corridor and potential impacts to these utilities. Tasks include identifying existing Utility Agency Owners (UAOs), making utility contacts, collecting and reviewing plans and data from UAOs, drawing utilities on conceptual plan sheets and adding discussion related to the utilities to the Project Study.

- f. A discussion of environmental concerns including contamination, wetlands and species including a discussion of environmental permitting requirements.
- g. A discussion of potential landscaping improvements.
- An analysis and discussion of the Penman Road/Florida Boulevard intersection options including discussion of the existing Roundabout Study prepared by Others.
- i. Analyze and make recommendations for midblock pedestrian crossing locations within the corridor.
- Evaluation for lighting justification to determine if lighting design should be added along the corridor, at signalized intersections and midblock crossings.
- k. Collect traffic data and prepare traffic analyses as detailed in Section 2 below.

B. PROJECT SCOPE

1. Project General Tasks

- a. Public Information The Consultant team shall prepare for and attend up to six public information meetings. The first series of meetings will be project kickoff meetings. The second series of meetings will be project recommendations meetings. The Consultant team will provide for Portable Changeable Message Signs (PCMS) to be placed a week before the meetings on both ends of the project (two boards for a total of 6 weeks). Tasks include the preparation of a Public Participation Plan, addressing Project Branding, Survey preparation including developing questions and formatting presentation results for two rounds of surveys, project website development, and maintenance and developing content, graphics and copy for social media throughout the study preparation. This task also includes rental of two Portable Changeable Message Signs (PCMS) a total of six times for a period of seven days.
- Notice to Proceed Meeting The Consultant team shall prepare for and attend one Notice to Proceed Meeting with City of Jacksonville (COJ) staff.
- c. Project Status Meetings The appropriate members of the Consulting team shall attend up to five progress meetings with COJ staff to discuss project progress and status, upcoming events and activities. The purpose of these meetings is to maintain clear communication between the COJ and the Project Team. The Consultant shall prepare and distribute meeting minutes following each of these meetings. These meetings will be conducted prior to starting the Study and Conceptual Plans, at each submittal and at any other appropriate milestones.

- d. Project Schedule The Consultant shall prepare and submit a project schedule for this project identifying major tasks, their duration and tasks relationships. The schedule shall be updated monthly and provided to the COJ.
- e. Invoices/Progress Report Invoices shall be prepared in the format prescribed by the COJ and submitted monthly. Progress reports shall be submitted with each monthly invoice.
- f. Quality Assurance/Quality Control The Consultant shall designate appropriate staff to conduct Quality Assurance/Quality Control (QA/QC) reviews of all work products prior to submittals to the COJ.

2. Project Study

The Consultant will perform the necessary analyses and prepare the discussions as described in Part A. Section 3. These analyses and discussions will be compiled into a single report with Appendices that will be submitted to the City of Jacksonville for review and approval. The Study will be prepared with consideration given to the COJ Land Development Procedures Manual, COJ Standard Details and Specifications and the Manual of Uniform Minimum Standards for Design, Construction and Maintenance for Streets and Highways (Florida Greenbook). The following tasks will also be included:

a. Data Collection

- Weekday AM, Midday and PM peak period and Saturday Midday Peak Period turning movement counts will be conducted along Penman Road at Beach Boulevard, 2nd Avenue North, 4th Avenue North, 6th Avenue North (Southern Terminus), 8th Avenue North, 15th Avenue North, 18th Avenue North, Arden Way, 20th Avenue North, Florida Boulevard/Forest Avenue, Cedar Street and Atlantic Boulevard. These counts will include a separate tabulation for autos, trucks, buses, pedestrians and bicyclists.
- Seven-day machine counts will be conducted along Penmen Road; north of Beach Boulevard - classification, north of 8th Avenue North - traffic volume, north of Seagate Avenue - traffic volume and north of Florida Boulevard classification.
- A vehicle speed study will be conducted at two locations along Penman Road, north of 8th Avenue North and north of Florida Boulevard.
- Crash data for accidents along Penman Road will be obtained and analyzed from Signal 4 Analytics for the last five years.
- Existing signal timings and signal plans for the signalized intersections will be obtained from the City of Jacksonville and Florida Department of Transportation.

b. Government Coordination

- The City of Jacksonville Planning Department will be contacted to determine if there are any developments planned for the area that will affect traffic along Penman Road.
- The City of Jacksonville Planning Department Bicycle and Pedestrian coordinator will be contacted to discuss pedestrian and bicycle routes.
- The City of Jacksonville Traffic Operations Department will be contacted to determine if there are any roadways planned for the area that will affect traffic along Penman Road.
- The Jacksonville Transportation Authority will be contacted to determine existing and planned transit along Penman Road.

c. Future Growth Projection

 Future growth along Penman Road will be based on the latest Northeast Regional Planning Model Activity Based (NERPM-AB.2.1.1) travel demand forecasting model (provided by the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization – NFTPO), which was prepared as part of the TPO's 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan update. The model will be run for existing conditions, 2030 No-Build (existing) conditions, 2030 Build (design year) conditions, 2045 No-Build (existing) conditions and 2045 Build (design year) conditions.

d. No-Build Traffic

 The existing peak hour traffic as obtained from the traffic volumes will be adjusted using FDOT weekly factors to existing peak season peak hour traffic. The existing peak season peak hour traffic will be increased by the model annual growth rate to obtain the No-Build (existing conditions) traffic volumes.

e. Build (Design) Traffic

 2030 and 2045 Design traffic will be calculated by applying the NERPM_AB model growth factors to the 2030 and 2045 No-Build traffic.

f. Signal Warrant Analysis

 A signal warrant analysis will be conducted at the Penman Road/8th Avenue North intersection and Penman Road/Seagate Avenue intersections.

g. Left and Right Turn Lane Warrant Analysis

 Using the criteria contained in the City of Jacksonville's Land Development Procedures, the need for exclusive left or right turn lanes will be evaluated at all major and minor intersections along the Penman Road corridor. For all warranted lanes, the appropriate storage length will be calculated.

h. Roadway Segment Analysis

 A roadway segment analysis will be conducted to determine the appropriate laneage for Penman Road.

i. Intersection Analysis

 Existing and Design year condition intersection analyses will be conducted for both the weekday AM and PM peak hours and Saturday Midday peak hour at all study area intersections. The movement/approach level of service (LOS) and corresponding delay will be provided for each condition at each intersection.

j. Roundabout Analysis

 The Penman Road/Florida Boulevard intersection will be analyzed as a roundabout. A roundabout study has been completed for this intersection. PY will review and update the analysis to conform to the Complete Streets design.

k. Recommended Intersection Improvements

 Based on the results of the traffic study, the roadway laneage, intersection geometry, bicycle treatment, pedestrian treatment and transit stop locations will be identified and recommended to ensure a safe and efficient Complete Streets project.

3. Conceptual Plan Sheets

The Consultant will prepare one (1) set of Conceptual Plan Sheets on an aerial photograph background. These Conceptual Plan Sheets will show limits of pavement (including roadway and sidewalk) and required signing and pavement markings for the recommended alternative outlined in the Project Study.

4. Construction Cost Estimate

The Consultant will provide an engineer's estimate of probable cost for the recommended alternative outlined in the Project Study.

C. PROJECT DELIVERABLES

There will be two (2) submittals for this project (Initial Study and Final Study). The Study will be submitted as one (1) document in PDF format.

D. PROJECT SCHEDULE

An eighteen (18) month schedule is anticipated for this project. The Consultant will provide a project schedule to the COJ no later than 20 days after Notice to Proceed (NTP). The schedule will be based on the scope requirements as outlined herein.

E. CITY OF JACKSONVILLE'S RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Documents

The COJ shall provide access to any available plans, maps and other pertinent information under its control essential to the satisfactory completion of the work indicated herein.

2. Reviews

The COJ will provide timely reviews of the Consultant's work in accordance with the schedule agreed upon between the COJ and the Consultant. Each review period by the COJ shall be three weeks, at which time all comments will be forwarded to the Consultant.

F. ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. This effort does not include any geotechnical investigations.
- 2. This effort does not include any design survey or subsurface utility engineering efforts.
- 3. This effort does not include wetland delineation.

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
