ORDINANCE 2021-

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE WASTEWATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM; AMENDING THE 2021-2025 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY 2020-505-E ORDINANCE TO REALLOCATE WITHIN THE PROJECT ENTITLED "WATER/WASTEWATER SYSTEM FUND" FOR SEPTIC TANK PHASE-OUT PROJECTS 2021-2022 AND IN FISCAL YEARS 2022-2023; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Jacksonville established the Wastewater System Improvement Program (the "Program") to promote the environment and the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and to improve surface water quality of the St. Johns River and its tributaries through the elimination of on-site wastewater treatment and disposal systems throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, the Program is a joint initiative between the City, JEA and key stakeholders in the Jacksonville area and was implemented, in part, to identify various funding opportunities to pay for construction of central water and wastewater treatment systems throughout the city, with a priority given to those areas of the city in greatest need of these services; and

WHEREAS, this Program is also designed to assist the City in prioritizing projects to meet its obligations under the Basin Management Action Plan (the "BMAP") for both the lower mainstream of the St. Johns River and its tributaries which includes, but is not limited to, removal of septic tanks that contribute pollutants to

existing surface water bodies; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to reallocate funds appropriated to the 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") project entitled "Water/Wastewater System Fund" to fiscal years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023 (CIP years 2 and 3) to fund various septic tank phase-out projects; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. 2020-505-E, adopting the 2021-2025 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reallocate funding within the project entitled "Water/Wastewater System Fund" for septic tank phase-out projects in fiscal years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023, as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet, attached hereto as Exhibit and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary delay of projects designed to improve surface water quality by removing septic tanks that are contributing pollutants to existing surface water bodies and to meet the City's obligations under the BMAP. to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this Section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2020-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2020-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.

Funding will be initially designated as debt proceeds, the payments on which will be made possible through freed up general fund capacity upon enactment of the Local Option Gas Tax which will support the City's planned transportation infrastructure projects.
