#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Bernardo called the meeting to order at about 2:06 PM.

#### 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Scott Wilson provided comments regarding the rehired retirees topic on the meeting agenda. He urged the Board to make sure the matter was fully and properly considered and to delay any decisions until that time. He also wanted to ensure past practices are considered.

James Poindexter commented that he employed a court reporter to record the meeting and confirm that they can pause the meeting to record if there are any problems.

Mr. Hughes asked staff to ensure the meeting is being recorded on Zoom. Mr. Stadelmaier said the meeting would be recorded via Zoom.

#### 3. <u>MINUTES</u>

Mr. Greive made a motion to approve the minutes. Mr. Hughes seconded the motion. The Chair asked for discussion and there was none. The Chair took a vote and the minutes passed unanimously.

#### 4. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

#### Consent agendas

Mr. Greive made a motion to approve the consent. Mr. Hughes seconded the motion. The Chair summoned for discussion and asked Mr. Stadelmaier if there is any unusual activity in the prepared consent. Mr. Stadelmaier responded that there was nothing unusual in the prepared consent. The Chair took a vote and the consent passed unanimously.

#### 5. INVESTMENT AND FINANCIAL MATTERS

Mr. Merrell reviewed the December performance which showed gains of 3.41%. He provided a performance update through January as 2.9% MTD and 17.2% FYTD.

Mr. Merrell discussed recent due diligence completed on the watch-listed managers, Franklin Templeton "FT" and Pinnacle. FT initially reduced their market risk but they have shifting to a more "risk on" trade due to the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccine and perceived reduced geopolitical risks. FT sees long-term investment opportunities from the reopening trade. They are investing in countries with robust global trade and in nations that have rebounded quicker from COVID-19. Mr. Merrell highlighted their overweight to South Korea, Indonesia, and Mexico. He reported Pinnacle's performance has bounced back and Pinnacle believes their portfolio will benefit from significant pent-up demand and the reopening of trade. Pinnacle has positioned the portfolio in machinery, material, hospitality, railroads, aerospace, automation, and technology that they believe will have a long economic runway. Pinnacle highlighted the fact that inventories are low and

product backlogs are starting to increase as manufacturing starts to rebound. Their recent performance has significantly outpaced their benchmark. Mr. Barnes also acknowledged Pinnacle's improvements.

Mr. Merrell reported contract work with Hamilton Lane is going well and the HL account is now open at BNYM. Adams Street has deployed about \$8M with the latest investment happening later this week. Mr. Greive asked for a reminder on the amounts committed and Mr. Merrell said it's \$105M to private equity and \$130M to private credit, both of which will ramp up over time. Mr. Greive recognized staff and legal for their great work in getting the contracts ready which can be complicated and challenging.

#### 6. OLD BUSINESS

Mr. Stadelmaier gave an update on 2020-529, the limited retirement option window program. As anticipated, a substitute bill excluding JEA employees and updating some of the administrative process was introduced at Council committee. It is working through committee and anticipated to go to full Council in February. An updated impact statement was provided by Segal and it shows as expected roughly half of the impact of the original with some nuances related to JEA exclusion.

Chair Bernardo asked if the Board wanted to contemplate making a comment regarding making the plan whole for the change once the full impact is known. Mr. Greive commented that the change will be captured in the new valuation after the program and he is in favor of considering it at that time, which would be consistent with the Board's past approach. Mr. Hughes added that the specifics are still unknown, and the Board would be in a better position to make a judgement in a year or longer. Mr. Hughes added the data currently does not support the notion that this change will create a crisis. Ms. Gutierrez said she supports waiting until we know the value of the impact after the program. Mr. Greive added that there are offsetting financial positives as well that can be considered after some time has passed. Mr. Hughes said the adoption of this idea was done primarily for a subset of employees related to COVID concerns and employees that could benefit from this opportunity. Mr. Wallace said the impact of \$7M at the 25% take-rate was not good for the Plan but that there should be reduced expenses for the City from reduced employees, potentially. Mr. Hughes commented that we cannot rely on the budgetary savings at this point but that the current data does not support a substantial financial impact to the Plan.

#### 7. ADMINISTRATIVE

Mr. Stadelmaier shared the components of the executive reporting that the pension office is working on as requested and asked the Board to provide feedback on any changes they would like to see. The pension office plans to roll out the components over the next year.

Mr. Stadelmaier provided an update on the Pryce-Jones case. There was a trial last week and we are awaiting a ruling in the matter.

Mr. Stadelmaier provided background on rehired retiree rules and some parts that require further clarification with the goal to have clear and consistent rules going forward and to address employee and retiree questions. Mr. Hughes asked if the intention today was to have initial discussion to eventually update Board rules and code. Mr. Stadelmaier said yes and to keep in mind some people are awaiting information to make decisions.

There was further discussion regarding necessary code clarifications. Ms. Gutierrez mentioned she supported this and some other items like the rule on surviving spouse benefits. Mr. Stadelmaier appreciated that and made a distinction between technical code clarifications and items that may require negotiations such as changes to benefit amounts and eligibility.

Mr. Hughes made a motion to form a committee with Mr. Greive, Ms. Gutierrez, and Ms. Moser to review needed Board rule and code clarifications. Mr. Greive seconded the motion. The Chair asked for further discussion and seeing none took a vote. The motion passed unanimously. It was also mentioned that other Board members are invited to participate with the committee.

Mr. Stadelmaier let the board know the pension office has been looking into ways to improve the audio and video associated with the meetings with the need for Zoom hybrid meetings. There is a significant cost to meeting all the needs of a hybrid meeting experience, as a vendor quoted about \$30K to make the improvements. Mr. Stadelmaier said the pension office is exploring alternatives as well. Ms. Gutierrez asked about using other rooms and Mr. Stadelmaier said that has been explored but booking and proximity have been a challenge and that the Board room supports multiple meetings and audiences outside of the monthly Board meeting. Mr. Hughes suggested it may help to wait a couple of months before making a large investment to see how the meetings progress with changes related to the vaccine roll-out. Mr. Hughes also said that it may make sense to make improvements especially since it could have benefits beyond the Board meeting. Mr. Stadelmaier said we will continue with the current setup for now and he will share any new updates with the Board on options.

#### 9. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Mr. Stadelmaier thanked the pension staff, especially Hannah Hicks and Sheryl Strickland for their work on the meetings and customer service with a high volume and current short staff. He also recognized LizMary Abreu for her work on 1099Rs and the Treasury team and mailroom for their help in completing delivery of 1099Rs to stay compliant. Mr. Greive added his thanks and support for the pension office team as well.

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
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
# **Capital Markets Review**

#### Fourth Quarter Economic Environment

In Q4, multiple fundamental developments reinforced market sentiment and kept many investors positioned to add incremental risk despite the relatively weak economic environment and worsening global pandemic. Importantly, two closely watched coronavirus vaccine trials from Pfizer/BioNTech and Moderna released promising efficacy results leading to emergency use authorizations from the FDA, allowing market participants to pull forward expectations for normalized economic activity for much of the developed world in 2021. Investors also reacted favorably to completed negotiations around new fiscal stimulus following the November US elections, which culminated in a \$900B package being signed into law under a larger omnibus spending bill. The package included new supplemental unemployment benefits of \$300 per week for the 6.7% of unemployed Americans, as well as another one-time round of stimulus checks in the amount of \$600 for most individuals. The Fed reiterated its commitment to maintain monthly asset purchases, currently at \$120B, and zero interest rates until the economy makes significant progress toward its goal of full employment. Given the backdrop of supportive monetary and fiscal policies, risk assets posted another guarter of stellar returns. Though financial markets have rebounded from the sharp drawdown in early 2020, global economic activity remains well off its pre-pandemic peak.

#### **Broad Market**


US equity markets finished strong in Q4 following a period of heightened volatility earlier in the quarter. Negotiations around another US fiscal stimulus package stalled in October and spikes in coronavirus infections contributed to the S&P 500 Index returning -2.7% for the month. In the latter half of the quarter, optimism around vaccine authorization, the announcement of additional stimulus in December, and the prospect of further fiscal support drove positive investor sentiment.

#### Market Cap

Additionally, small-cap stocks fared best in Q4, a reversal of what was seen in Q3. The prospect of lockdowns easing in 2021 also contributed to strong performance for small-cap stocks, with the Russell 2000 Index up 31.4% relative to the S&P 500 Index returning 12.1%.

#### **Style and Sector**


This quarter marked the end of a consistent string of growth-led quarters, with value stocks outperforming their growth counterparts.

#### **Developed Markets**


Developed international markets had another strong quarter of returns. Value stocks outperformed growth, while small stocks beat their larger counterparts. Nearly all developed market countries saw double digit positive returns for the quarter. Active management saw split results during the quarter, with a majority of small-cap developed international equity managers beating their benchmarks while the majority of large-cap managers underperformed.

#### **Emerging Markets**


Emerging markets outpaced developed during the quarter continuing the trend for the third quarter in a row. Emerging market value stocks outperformed growth, while small stocks continued their outperformance of large since Q2. All sectors posted positive performance for the quarter led by technology, but more value-oriented sectors were not far behind.

#### Market Cap & Style


In both developed international markets and emerging markets, value stocks outperformed growth, while small-cap stocks outperformed large-cap.

Fourth Quarter Review

#### **Broad Market**


The Bloomberg US Aggregate Index returned a modest 0.7% in Q4, capping off a 7.5% YTD return and an overall strong year for US fixed income, supported by record fiscal and monetary stimulus. In Q4, the Treasury yield curve steepened as front end rates remained anchored near zero, a sign of the Federal Reserve's continued support, while yields for intermediate- and long-dated maturities increased over Q4.


#### **Credit Market**

The Bloomberg US Credit Index returned 2.8% for Q4 2020, outperforming the broader fixed income market. Despite record-setting new issuance, credit spreads continued to tighten, compressing to 92 bps.

#### **Emerging Market Debt**

Emerging market debt also ended the year on a high note, with the JPM EMBI Global Diversified Index returning 5.8% for the quarter. However, the hard currency index was overshadowed by its local currency counterpart.

The hedge fund industry posted double digit gains in back to back years for the first time since 2009-2010 as the HFRI Fund Weighted Composite Index returned 10.7% in Q4, bringing YTD returns to 11.6%. Equity Long/Short ("ELS") managers led the way, reporting a Q4 return of 14.5% and a full-year return of 17.5% in one of the best alpha-generating years for fundamental equity managers in recent memory.

#### **General Market - Global Tactical Asset Allocation (GTAA)**

Performance across GTAA strategies RVK follows closely generated positive absolute returns during the quarter ranging from mid-single digits to low doubledigits. Long-biased strategies reported mixed performance versus a static and less diversified blend of 60% US equity and 40% US fixed income. Broadly speaking, strategies that have kept higher levels of risk and equity exposure have tended to outperform peers that opted to keep equity allocations relatively muted.

#### Fourth Quarter Review - Real Assets


#### **General Market - Diversified Inflation Strategies (DIS)**

Performance for DIS managers that RVK follows closely largely generated positive absolute performance during Q4, while producing mix results for the full year. For the quarter, most traditionally inflationsensitive asset classes were drivers of positive returns. In Q4, strategies with relatively larger allocations to segments with higher historical volatility, such as REITs, listed infrastructure and global natural resources, generated stronger relative returns versus peers.


#### **General Market - Real Estate**

Core private real estate returned 1.3% in Q4, as reported by the NFI-ODCE Index, with the total return comprised of 0.9% income and 0.4% price appreciation. While the income component remained relatively healthy and in-line with historical levels, price appreciation rebounded meaningfully from a negative return in Q3. Investors in publicly traded real estate outperformed their private market counterparts by a meaningful margin.





Total Fund Attribution - IDP vs. Current Total Fund Policy Index








Total Fund Attribution - IDP vs. Legacy Total Fund Policy Index




#### City of Jacksonville Employees' Retirement System Fixed Income vs. IM Global Fixed Income (SA+CF) Peer Group Analysis










#### Portfolio Characteristics and Dist. of Market Cap (%)






#### Portfolio Characteristics and Dist. of Market Cap (%)






#### Portfolio Characteristics and Dist. of Market Cap (%)



#### Portfolio Characteristics and Dist. of Market Cap (%)





Sector Distribution (%)











#### **Investment Strategy**

The Fund's strategy is on primarily stabilized income-producing investments in niche sectors; Education, Health, and Storage. Within these sectors the fund invests in student housing, seniors housing, medical office buildings, life science buildings, and self-storage. 




### Investment Strategy

The Fund pursues a diversified core-plus real estate strategy that seeks to outperform the NCREIF ODCE Index by 100 basis points over a complete market cycle by structuring investments to enhance risk-adjusted returns. Investments may be made through direct property ownership or indirectly through such vehicles as joint ventures, general or limited partnerships, limited liability companies, mortgage loans and other loan types, including mezzanine debt, and debt secured by an interest in the borrowing entity or interests in companies or entities that directly or indirectly hold real estate or real estate interests. 



## **Relative Performance - Since Inception**








Actual Correlation - 10 Years







Prior to 11/01/2017, the Current Total Fund Policy Index consists of the Legacy Total Fund Policy Index.
- Legacy Total Fund Policy Index: The passive Legacy Total Fund Policy Index is calculated monthly and currently consists of 35% Russell 3000 Index, 20% MSCI ACW Ex US Index (USD) (Net), 19% Fixed Income Index, 15% NCREIF ODCE Index (AWA) (Net), 10% Diversifying Assets Index, and 1% FTSE 3 Mo US T-Bill Index.
- US Equity Index: The passive US Equity Index consists of 100% DJ US TSM Index through 06/2009 and 100% Russell 3000 Index thereafter.
- International Equity Index: The passive International Equity Index consists of 100% MSCI EAFE Index (USD) (Gross) through 01/2011 and 100% MSCI ACW Ex US Index (USD) (Net) thereafter.
- Fixed Income Index: The passive Fixed Income Index consists of 100% Bloomberg US Agg Bond Index through 10/2017 and 100% Bloomberg US Universal Bond Index thereafter.
- Diversifying Assets Index: The Diversifying Assets Index is calculated monthly and consists of 50% S&P MLP Index (TR)/50% NCREIF Timberland Index through 10/2017, 67% S&P MLP Index (TR)/33% NCREIF Timberland Index through 09/2020, and calculated monthly using beginning of month investment weights applied to each corresponding primary benchmark return thereafter.

- Vanguard Spliced Real Estate Index: The Vanguard Spl Real Estate Index consists of MSCI US REIT Index (USD) (Gross) adjusted to include a 2% cash position (Lipper Money Market Average) through 04/30/2009, MSCI US REIT Index (USD) (Gross) through 01/31/2018, MSCI US IM Real Estate 25/50 Transition Index through 07/24/2018, and MSCI US IM Real Estate 25/50 Index (Gross) thereafter.
- Tortoise Spliced Index: The passive Tortoise Spliced Index consists of 100% S&P MLP Index (TR) through 07/2020 and 100% Alerian Midstream Energy Index thereafter.



Active Return - The difference between the investment manager/composite performance relative to the performance of an appropriate market benchmark.

Active Share - Measures the degree to which the holdings of a fund differ from the holdings of the benchmark. Active share is calculated by taking the sum of the absolute value of the differences of the weight of each holding in the fund versus the weight of each holding in the benchmark and dividing by two

Alpha - A measure of the difference between a portfolio's actual returns and its expected performance, given its level of risk as measured by beta. It is a measure of the portfolio's historical performance not explained by movements of the market or a portfolio's non-systematic return.

Alpha Ratio - A measure of a portfolio's non-systematic return per unit of downside risk. It is measured by dividing the alpha of a portfolio by the downside risk. The non-systematic return is a measure of a portfolio's historical performance not explained by movements of the market.

Average Quality - Bond guality ratings are reported using the investment managers' and the index providers' preferred rating agency. Average Quality for managers unable to provide this statistic is instead provided by Morningstar; if unavailable on Morningstar, it has been estimated using a credit quality distribution provided by the manager. There are two primary rating agencies in the US. Moody's assigns ratings on a system that employs up to four symbols (consisting of letters and numbers), such as, Aaa, Aa2, etc., with Aaa being the highest or safest rating. Standard & Poor's (S&P) employs a system that uses + and - along with letters, such as AAA, AA+, etc. The two rating agencies' systems are summarized below:

Benchmark Effect - The difference between the blended return of each respective managers' benchmark within a composite and the composite's benchmark return.

Beta - A measure of the sensitivity of a portfolio to the movements in the market. It is a measure of a portfolio's non-diversifiable or systematic risk.

Box Plots - A graphical representation of the distribution of observations. From top to bottom, the four boxes represent the spread between the maximum value and the minimum value in each quartile. A quartile represents the values that divide the observations into four quarters (i.e., 1<sup>st</sup> quartile, 2<sup>nd</sup> guartile, 3<sup>rd</sup> guartile, and 4<sup>th</sup> guartile). The median observation is where the 2<sup>nd</sup> guartile and 3<sup>rd</sup> guartile meet.

Buy and Hold Attribution - At the beginning of the time period under analysis, the manager and benchmark portfolios are broken down into segments (i.e., styles, sectors, countries, and regions) based on the desired type of attribution. The formula assumes zero turn-over to the manager and benchmark portfolios throughout the period and calculates the segment returns ("buy and hold returns") to arrive at performance attribution. Due to portfolio turnover, buy and hold attribution may not accurately represent quarterly performance relative to the benchmark. Country, region, sector, and style allocations are as of the date one quarter prior to the reporting date, and the returns shown are for those segments throughout the quarter reported. Due to disclosure guidelines set by each investment manager, equity characteristics shown are as of the most recent date available. The following is the methodology for segment classification:

Sector - Attribution is calculated using the Global Industry Classification Standard (GICS), which is a detailed and comprehensive structure for sector and industry analysis. Stocks are classified by their primary sector as defined by S&P Capital IQ data.

Country/Region - Attribution is calculated using the Morgan Stanley Capital International (MSCI) region standards. Stocks are classified by their domicile country/region, as defined by S&P Capital IQ data, and thus may differ from the classification of the investment manager and/or index provider.

Style - Stocks are classified into the following style boxes: large/mid/small vs. growth/neutral/value. Stocks are classified along large/mid/small categories at the time of the Russell index rebalancing, using the index market cap boundaries as cutoff points. Stocks are classified along growth/neutral/value categories at the time of the Russell index rebalancing, using the price/book ratio as supplied by S&P Capital IQ. Stocks in the Russell 3000 Index portfolio are sorted by price/book ratio; names with the highest price/book ratio that make up 1/3 of the total market capitalization are assigned to the growth category, and names that make up the subsequent 1/3 of the total market capitalization are assigned to the neutral category, while the balance of the names are assigned to the value category. Stocks are unclassified when there is not enough data to determine a size and style metric.

Portfolio Characteristics and Buy and Hold Attribution reports utilize product-specific data for all mutual funds and commingled funds.

#### **Capital Markets Review -**

Breakeven Inflation - Measures the expected inflation rate at each stated maturity by taking the difference between the real yield of the inflationlinked maturity curve and the yield of the closest nominal Treasury maturity.

Consumer Confidence - Measures domestic consumer confidence as defined by the degree of optimism on the state of the economy that consumers express through saving and spending.

Consumer Price Index (CPI) - Measures the change in the price level of consumer goods and services.

**Federal Funds Rate** - The interest rate at which a depository institution lends funds maintained at the Federal Reserve to another depository institution overnight. It is one of the most influential interest rates in the US economy, since it affects monetary and financial conditions, which in turn have a bearing on key aspects of the broad economy including employment, growth and inflation.

Option-Adjusted Spread - Measures the flat spread of an index or bond to the Treasury yield curve after removing the effect of any embedded options.

Purchasing Managers Index (PMI) - Measures economic activity by surveying purchasing managers on a monthly basis as to whether business conditions have improved, worsened, or stayed the same.

Real Gross Domestic Product (Real GDP) - An inflation-adjusted measure that reflects the value of all goods and services produced by an economy in a given year.

Unemployment Rate - The percentage of the total labor force that is unemployed but actively seeking employment.

US Dollar Total Weighted Index - Measures the value of the US Dollar relative to a basket of other world currencies. It is calculated as the weighted geometric mean of the dollar's value versus the EUR, GBP, CAD, SEK, CHF, and JPY.

VIX - Measures the implied volatility of S&P 500 Index options by looking at the market's expectation of the S&P 500 Index volatility over the next 30 day period. Commonly referred to as the "fear index" or the "fear gauge."

Cash Flow Effect - The composite's active return minus the sum of each managers' active return minus the benchmark effect.

**Consistency** - The percentage of quarters that a product achieved a rate of return higher than that of its benchmark. The higher the consistency figure, the more value a manager has contributed to the product's performance.

Convexity - A measure of the shape of the curve that describes the relationship between bond prices and bond yields.

**Correlation** - A statistical measure of the relationship between asset class returns. A value of 1.00 is a perfect correlation; that is, the asset classes always move in the same direction. A value of -1.00 indicates a perfect negative correlation, in which the asset classes always move in opposite directions of each other. A value of 0 indicates there is no relationship between the direction of returns of the two asset classes. Correlation calculations only consider the direction of changes relative to two variables and not the magnitude of those changes.

Coupon Rate - The percentage rate of interest paid on a bond or fixed income security; it is typically paid twice per year.

Current Yield - The annual income of a security divided by the security's current price.

**Down Market Capture** - Down market by definition is negative benchmark return and down market capture represents the ratio in % terms of the average portfolios return over the benchmark during the down market period. The lower the value of the down market capture the better the product's performance.

**Downside Risk** - A measure similar to standard deviation that focuses only on the negative movements of the return series. It is calculated by taking the standard deviation of the negative returns for the selected periodicity. The higher the factor, the riskier the product.

Earnings Per Share - It is backward looking, calculated using the one year current EPS divided by the one year EPS five years ago.

Effective Duration - The approximate percentage change in a bond's price for a 100 basis point change in yield.

Excess Return vs. Market - Average of the monthly arithmetic difference between the manager's return and the benchmark return over a specified time period, shown on an annualized basis.

**Excess Return vs. Risk Free** - Average of the monthly arithmetic difference between the manager's return and the risk-free return (i.e., ICE BofAML 3 Mo US T-Bill Index unless specified otherwise) over a specified time period, shown on an annualized basis.

Excess Risk - A measure of the standard deviation of a portfolio's performance relative to the risk-free return.

Expense Ratios - Morningstar is the source for mutual fund expense ratios.

Gain/Loss - The net increase or decrease in the market value of a portfolio excluding its Net Cash Flow for a given period.

**Indices** - All indices and related information are considered intellectual property and are licensed by each index provider. The indices may not be copied, used, or distributed without the index provider's prior written approval. Index providers make no warranties and bear no liability with respect to the indices, any related data, their quality, accuracy, suitability, and/or completeness.

**Information Ratio** - Measured by dividing the active rate of return by the tracking error. The higher the information ratio, the more value-added contribution by the manager.

Liability Driven Investing (LDI) - A method to optimally structure asset investments relative to liabilities. The change in liabilities is estimated by the Ryan Labs Generic PPA Index of appropriate duration for that Plan. This benchmark is based on generic data and is therefore an approximation. RVK is not an actuarial firm, and does not have actuarial expertise.

Estimated Funded Status - The estimated ratio of a Plan's assets relative to its future liabilities. This is calculated by dividing the Plan's asset market value by the estimated present value of its liabilities. The higher the estimated funded status, the better the Plan's ability to cover its projected benefit obligations. An estimated funded status of 100% indicates a Plan that is fully funded.

**Estimated PV of Liabilities** - An estimate of a Plan's future liabilities in present value terms. The beginning of the period liability is provided by the Plan's actuary. The period-end present value liability estimate provided in this report is derived by applying the estimated percentage change generated using the Ryan Labs Generic PPA Index with duration similar to that reported on the most recent actuarial valuation report. **Duration of Liabilities** - The sensitivity of the value of a Plan's liabilities to changes in interest rates, as calculated by the Plan's actuary.

Duration of Assets - The dollar-weighted average duration of all the individual Plan assets.

**Estimated Plan Hedge Ratio** - The estimate of how well a Plan's investment portfolio is hedged against changes in interest rates - a primary driver of funded status movements. This is calculated by dividing the dollar-weighted values of both the Plan asset duration by the liability duration and

multiplying by the estimated funded status. An estimated plan hedge ratio of zero indicates that the Plan's liabilities have not been hedged, whereas a value of one indicates fully hedged.

Modified Duration - The approximate percentage change in a bond's price for a 100 basis point change in yield, assuming the bonds' expected cash flows do not change.

**Mutual Fund Performance** - Whenever possible, manager performance is extended for any share class that does not have 10 years of history. Using Morningstar's methodology, a single ticker within the same fund family (often the oldest share class) is chosen to append historical performance.

**Net Cash Flow** - The sum, in dollars, of a portfolio's contributions and withdrawals. This includes all management fees and expenses only when performance shown is gross of fees.

#### Peer Groups -

Plan Sponsor Peer Groups - RVK utilizes the Mellon Analytical Solutions Trust Universe along with the Investment Metrics Plan Sponsor Universe. The combined Mellon Analytical Solutions Trust Universe and Investment Metrics Plan Sponsor Universe is used for comparison of total fund composite results and utilizes actual client performance compiled from consultant and custodian data. The Plan Sponsor Peer Group database includes performance and other quantitative data for over 2,100 plans which include corporate, endowment, foundation, public, and Taft Hartley plans. Plan Sponsor Peer Groups are gross of fees.

**Investment Manager Peer Groups** - RVK utilizes Investment Metrics' Peer Groups for investment manager peer comparison and ranking. The Investment Metrics Peer Group database includes performance and other quantitative data for over 840 investment management firms and 29,000 investments products, across more than 160 standard peer groups. Mutual Fund Peer Groups are net of fees.

**Percentile Rankings** - Percentile rank compares an individual fund's performance with those of other funds within a defined peer group of managers possessing a similar investment style. Percentile rank identifies the percentage of a fund's peer group that has a higher return (or other comparative measurement) than the fund being ranked. Conversely, 100 minus the individual fund's ranking will identify the percentage of funds within the peer group that have a lower return than the fund being ranked.

1 - Highest Statistical Value 100 - Lowest Statistical Value

Example: American Funds AMCP;R-4 (RAFEX) is ranked in the 4<sup>th</sup> percentile within the IM US Equity Large-Cap Growth Funds (MF) Peer Group for the Sharpe Ratio. Within the IM US Equity Large-Cap Growth Funds peer group, 4% of the other funds performed better than American Funds AMCP;R-4 (RAFEX), while 96% of the funds performed worse.

Performance Methodology - RVK calculates performance for investment managers and composites using different methodologies. Investment Managers - Performance is calculated for interim periods between all large external cash flows for a given month and geometrically linked to calculate period returns. An external cash flow is defined as cash, securities, or assets that enter or exit a portfolio. RVK defines a "large cash flow" as a net aggregate cash flow of ≥10% of the beginning-period portfolio market value or any cash flow that causes RVK calculated performance to deviate from manager/custodian reported performance in excess of 5 basis points for a given month. Composites - The Modified Dietz methodology is utilized to calculate asset class, sub-asset class, and total fund composite performance. The

Modified Dietz methodology is utilized to calculate asset class, sub-asset class, and total fund composite performance. The Modified Dietz method calculates a time-weighted total rate of return that considers the timing of external cash flows; however, it does not utilize interim period performance to mitigate the impact of significant cash in- and outflows to the composite.

RVK calculates performance beginning with the first full month following inception. Since inception performance may vary from manager reported performance due to RVK using the first full month of returns as the inception date. Performance for both managers and composites is annualized for periods greater than one year.

Portfolio Characteristics - Due to disclosure guidelines set by each investment manager, portfolio characteristics shown are as of the most recent date available.

Price to Earnings Ratio - The ratio valuing a company's current share price relative to its trailing 12-month per-share earnings (EPS).

**Private Equity Quartile Ranks** - Private Equity quartile ranks are generated using vintage year peer group data provided by Thomson Reuters, and are based on each fund's annualized, since inception internal rate of return (IRR). Three Private Equity peer groups are available via Thomson Reuters: Buyout, Venture, and All Private Equity. Ranks are available quarterly, at a one-quarter lag.

**R-Squared** - The percentage of a portfolio's performance explained by the behavior of the appropriate benchmark. High R-Squared means a higher correlation of the portfolio's performance to the appropriate benchmark.

Return - Compounded rate of return for the period.

% Return - The time-weighted rate of return of a portfolio for a given period.

Risk Free Benchmark – ICE BofAML 3 Mo US T-Bill Index unless specified otherwise.

**RVK Liquidity Rating** - A qualitative method for determining the relative amount of liquidity in a portfolio. The characteristics considered when determining relative liquidity include trading volume, gates for redemption, leverage, nature of transactions, and pricing mechanisms. The RVK Liquidity Rating is calculated using beginning of month investment weights applied to each corresponding asset class liquidity rating.

Sector Allocation - Negative fixed income sector allocation reflects manager's use of derivatives, short selling, or interest rate swaps.

Sharpe Ratio - Represents the excess rate of return over the risk-free return (i.e., ICE BofAML 3 Mo US T-Bill Index unless specified otherwise), divided by the standard deviation of the excess return to the risk free asset. The result is the absolute rate of return per unit of risk. The higher the value, the better the product's historical risk-adjusted performance.

Simple Alpha - The difference between the manager's return and the benchmark's return.

**Spread Duration** - The approximate percentage change in a bond's price for a 100 basis point change in its spread over a Treasury of the same maturity.

Standard Deviation - A statistical measure of the range of a portfolio's performance. The variability of a return around its average return over a specified time period.

Thematic Classification - Represents dedicated manager allocations; as such, thematic allocations are approximations. RVK categorizes the following asset classes as Alpha, Capital Appreciation, Capital Preservation, and Inflation:

**Total Fund Attribution** – The Investment Decision Process (IDP) model provides an approach to evaluating investment performance that applies to all asset classes and investment styles. The IDP model is based on a top-down hierarchy framework of investment decisions, with each decision contributing to the overall profit or loss. The IDP approach starts from the strategic asset allocation and follows the flow of the investments down to the manager's skill.

Strategic Asset Allocation (SAA) – The percentage return gained or lost from the long-term strategic asset allocation decision, the most significant determinant of long-term performance. SAA is the product of the target asset allocation multiplied by the corresponding benchmark returns. Tactical Asset Allocation (TAA) – The percentage return gained or lost from not having been precisely allocated at the target asset allocation mix, whether by deviations that are tactical in nature or a by-product of moving towards the target mix. TAA is the product of the actual asset allocation multiplied by the broad asset class benchmarks, less the SAA.

Style Selection (SS) – The percentage return gained or lost from intentional style biases within each asset class (e.g. value rather than core or overweight to emerging markets relative to benchmark). SS is the product of the actual manager allocation within each asset class multiplied by their specific benchmark, less TAA.

Manager's Skill (MS) – The percentage return gained or lost from manager value added relative to their specific benchmark. MS is the product of the actual manager allocation multiplied by their achieved excess return.

Total Fund Beta - Total Fund Beta is calculated using the S&P 500 as the benchmark. It represents a measure of the sensitivity of the total fund to movements in the S&P 500 and is a measure of the Total Fund's non-diversifiable or systematic risk.

Tracking Error - A measure of the standard deviation of a portfolio's performance relative to the performance of an appropriate market benchmark.

Treynor Ratio - Similar to Sharpe ratio, but focuses on beta rather than excess risk (standard deviation). Treynor ratio represents the excess rate of return over the risk-free rate (i.e., ICE BofAML 3 Mo US T-Bill Index unless specified otherwise) divided by the beta. The result is the absolute rate of return per unit of risk. The higher the value, the better historical risk-adjusted performance.

Unit Value - The dollar value of a portfolio, assuming an initial nominal investment of \$100, growing at the compounded rate of %Return for a given period.

Up Market Capture - Up market by definition is positive benchmark return and up market capture represents the ratio in % terms of the average portfolio's return over the benchmark during the up market period. The higher the value of the up market capture the better the product's performance.

Yield to Maturity - The rate of return achieved on a bond or other fixed income security assuming the security is bought and held to maturity and that the coupon interest paid over the life of the bond will be reinvested at the same rate of return. The 30-Day SEC Yield is similar to the Yield to Maturity and is reported for mutual funds.

Yield to Worst - The bond yield calculated by using the worst possible yield taking into consideration all call, put, and optional sink dates.

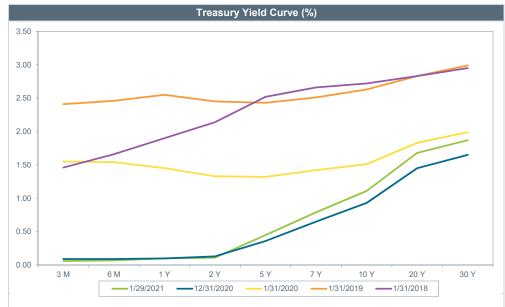

#### General Market Commentary

- Equity markets began the month strong, before pulling back sharply the last week of January, finishing
  with mixed results. Broad international and US indices ended the month roughly flat, although domestic
  small cap indices outperformed their large cap counterparts and finished with mid-single digit returns. The
  strong performance early in the month was largely due to vaccine and stimulus optimism, but pulled back
  in part due to renewed uncertainty over likelihood of the large \$1.9T stimulus package being passed by
  Congress, and due to the continued spread of COVID-19 combined with delays in vaccine distribution.
- Adding to the downwards pricing pressure on equity markets towards the end of the month, groups of
  retail investors attempted to enact a short squeeze on select hedge funds with large short interest in
  certain small cap stocks. Some hedge funds were forced to sell large amounts of liquid equity positions in
  order to remain solvent.
- At the January Federal Reserve meeting, the FOMC announced it would continue its pace of purchasing assets while keeping the federal funds rate near zero to support the economy, noting that the US' economic outlook remains uncertain.
- Equity markets posted negative returns in January as the S&P 500 (Cap Wtd) Index returned -1.01% and the MSCI EAFE (Net) Index returned -1.07%. Emerging markets returned 3.07% as measured by the MSCI EM (Net) Index.
- The Bloomberg US Aggregate Bond Index returned -0.72% in January, underperforming the -0.24% return by the Bloomberg US Treasury Intermediate Term Index. International fixed income markets returned -1.41%, as measured by the FTSE Non-US World Gov't Bond Index.
- Public real estate, as measured by the FTSE NAREIT Eq REITs Index (TR), returned 0.10% in January and 5.51% over the trailing five-year period.
- The Cambridge US Private Equity Index returned 13.35% for the trailing one-year period and 12.99% for the trailing five-year period ending September 2020.
- Absolute return strategies, as measured by the HFRI FOF Comp Index, returned -1.03% for the month and 9.37% over the trailing one-year period.
- Crude oil's price increased by 7.58% during the month, and has increased by 1.24% YoY.

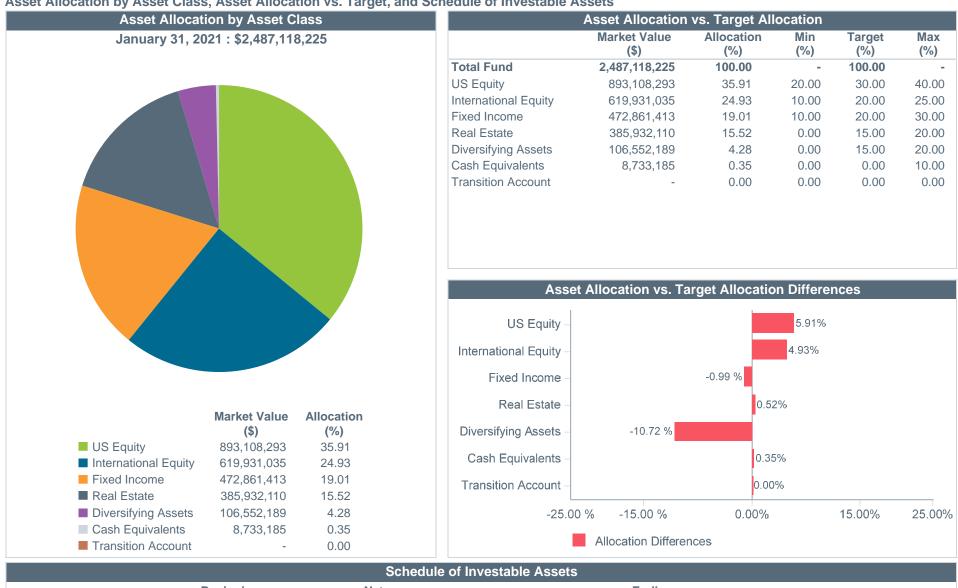

## Watch List Review

## Background

- At the October 2020 Board meeting, RVK proposed the adoption of a Watch List Policy to systematically monitor managers that are experiencing, or are expected to experience, challenges (e.g. performance or organization related).
- "On Watch" managers will be reviewed periodically to evaluate the stability of the investment team and firm and determine whether the Board, Staff, and RVK maintain conviction in the manager and their investment process.
- With the adoption of the Watch List Policy, RVK and Staff recommended two managers be placed on the Watch List due to prolonged underperformance relative to their benchmarks and peers:
  - Franklin Templeton Global Multisector Plus
  - Pinnacle Associates US SMID Cap Growth
- Following recently announced organizational changes, combined with prolonged underperformance relative to its benchmark and peers, RVK recommends adding the William Blair Small Cap Value strategy to the Watch List.
- The following slides provide a status update related to those managers currently on the Watch List, as well as additional details related to William Blair.



## Franklin Templeton Global Multisector Plus

- Franklin Templeton was originally hired in September 2007 to manage a global multisector core plus fixed income strategy for the System. The Plan's total exposure to the Franklin Templeton Global Multisector Plus strategy is \$98.6M as of 12/31/2020.
- Franklin Templeton was placed on the Watch List in October 2020 for the following reasons:
  - The strategy's rolling five-year return (net of fees) fell below the benchmark return for three consecutive quarters.

## Conclusion

- Given the Franklin Templeton Global Multisector Plus strategy continues to underperform it's benchmark and peer group over the trailing 5-year period, RVK and Staff believe that they should remain on the Watch List and will continue to monitor the manager closely and re-evaluate their status over the next 3-6 month period.
- Since the strategy's placement on the Watch List, RVK is not aware of any significant organizational/team developments or changes in investment process.
- There are several desired improvements to merit the strategy's removal from the Watch List:
  - A positive trend in excess performance, measured by the rolling five-year return (net of fees) versus a rolling five-year benchmark return.
  - An increase in RVK's peer universe ranking as measured by the rolling five-year return (gross of fees).
- RVK would note, as a result of the fixed income transition executed in February 2021, the Franklin Templeton Global Multisector Plus strategy now represents a smaller relative portion of the Plan's Core Plus Fixed Income Composite.



## Pinnacle Associates US SMID Cap Growth

- Pinnacle Associates was originally hired in March 2010 to manage a small/midcap growth strategy for the System. The Plan's total exposure to the Pinnacle US SMID Cap Growth strategy is \$143.7M as of 12/31/2020.
- Pinnacle was placed on the Watch List in October 2020 for the following reasons:
  - The strategy's rolling five-year return (net of fees) fell below the benchmark return for three consecutive quarters.

## Conclusion

- RVK recommends keeping the Pinnacle Associates US SMID Cap Growth strategy on the Watch List. Pinnacle delivered strong results in Q4 2020 as cyclical growth outperformed secular growth. However, the strategy continues to underperform over the trailing 5-year period relative to its benchmark and peers.
- Since the strategy's placement on the Watch List, RVK is not aware of any significant organizational/team developments or changes in investment process.
- There are several desired improvements to merit the strategy's removal from the Watch List:
  - A positive trend in excess performance, measured by the rolling five-year return (net of fees) versus a rolling five-year benchmark return.
  - An increase in RVK's peer universe ranking as measured by the rolling five-year return (gross of fees).



## William Blair Small Cap Value

- William Blair was originally hired in November 2014 to manage a small cap value strategy for the System. The Plan's total exposure to the William Blair Small Cap Value strategy is \$97.5M as of 12/31/2020.
- As of 12/31/2020, the strategy's rolling five-year return (net of fees) has fallen below the benchmark return for three consecutive quarters.

# William Blair Small Cap Value

# Recommendation

- William Blair recently announced they have a definitive agreement in place to acquire Investment Counselors of Maryland ("ICM").
  - The deal is expected to close during the second quarter of 2021.
  - Founded in 1972, ICM has a long history of value investing.
  - The 8-person team manages ~\$3.2 billion across US Small, SMID, and Mid cap strategies.
- As a result of the acquisition, William Blair will transition management of current small cap value mandates to the ICM team.
  - ICM's investment process shares similarities to that of the legacy William Blair team. However, ICM's portfolios are typically less concentrated (e.g. 100 stocks compared to 80-90 within small cap value) and their process has resulted in demonstrably better stock selection in recent time periods.
  - Furthermore, William Blair will be offering a fee reduction to separate account clients, to negate short-term transaction costs and facilitate long-term fee savings.
- This development marks a significant change in both key personnel and investment process for the strategy. Combined with the underperformance illustrated on the previous page, and in consistency with the COJ's Watch List Framework, RVK recommends adding William Blair Small Cap Value to the Watch List.
- While RVK Investment Manager Research does rank the ICM Small Cap Value Strategy
  positively, we believe that in light of this announcement, conducting a Small Cap Value search
  to review the market is warranted. That said, we recommend completing the upcoming
  Domestic Equity structure study first, to cement any intra composite shifts, which could impact
  existing mandates, exposures, and the nature of such a search.

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 120 (GENERAL EMPLOYEES AND CORRECTIONS OFFICER PENSION PLANS AND ALL EMPLOYEES DEFINED CONTRIBUTION RETIREMENT PLANS), PART II (THE GENERAL EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT PLAN), ORDINANCE CODE; CREATING A NEW SECTION 120.216 (2021 LIMITED RETIREMENT OPTION), ORDINANCE CODE, TO PROVIDE SIX MONTH WINDOW FOR NORMAL OR EARLY А RETIREMENT AS FOLLOWS: (1) NORMAL RETIREMENT AT THE AGE OF 60 WITH 5 YEARS OF CREDITED SERVICE; (2) NORMAL RETIREMENT AT THE AGE OF 55 WITH 10 YEARS OF CREDITED SERVICE; AND (3) EARLY RETIREMENT UPON COMPLETION OF 20 YEARS OF CREDITED SERVICE REGARDLESS OF AGE, WITH A REDUCED BENEFIT; REQUIRING CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; REQUIREMENT OF ACTUARIAL REPORT; PROVIDING FOR JEA COLLECTIVE BARGAINING; PROVIDING FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING WITH THE CITY UNIONS AND JACKSONVILLE HOUSING AUTHORITY; PROVIDING AN EXCEPTION TO THE PREREQUISITE THAT THE PLAN BE AT LEAST 90 PERCENT ACTUARILLY FUNDED; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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Creating a new Section 120.216, Ordinance Code. Section 1. 3 A new Section 120.216 (2021 Limited Retirement Option), Part II (The General Employees Retirement Plan), Chapter 120 (General Employees and Corrections Officer Pension Plans and All Employees Defined 5 Contribution Retirement Plans), Ordinance Code, is hereby created to 7 read as follows:

CHAPTER 120. GENERAL EMPLOYEES AND CORRECTIONS OFFICER PENSION PLANS AND ALL EMPLOYEES DEFINED CONTRIBUTION RETIREMENT PLANS.

PART II. THE GENERAL EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT PLAN

Sec. 120.216. 2021 Limited Retirement Option

- 1. City Employee Members and Jacksonville Housing Authority Members. 14 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Part II to the 15 (a) contrary, a member, excluding JEA employees, may retire between 16 April 1, 2021, and September 30, 2021, if on the date of such 17 retirement the member has attained: (1) age 55 with 10 years 18 of credited service, or (2) age 60 with 5 years of credited 19 20 service. A member who retires pursuant to this subsection (a) must retire between April 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021 and 21 shall receive a benefit of 2.5 percent per year of credited 22 service based on final monthly compensation and credited 23 24 service, defined by Sections 120.201 (i) and (n), as of the date of termination. 25
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision in this Part II to the 26 contrary, early retirement shall be available to a member, 27 excluding JEA employees, between April 1, 2021, and September 28 29 30, 2021, if on the date of early retirement the member has 30 completed 20 or more years of credited service, but less than

30 years of credited service, regardless of age. A member who retires pursuant to this subsection (b) must retire between April 1, 2021 and September 30, 2021 and shall receive a benefit of two percent per year of credited service, based on final monthly compensation and credited service, defined by Sections 120.201 (i) and (n), as of the date of termination.

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- 7 To be eligible for retirement under subsections (a) or (b) (C) above, in addition to meeting the age and/or time service 8 9 credit requirements, a member must submit written or electronic notice of the retirement election and the date of retirement 10 to the Board between April 1, 2021 and May 31, 2021. 11 Such election shall be binding on the member and irrevocable. In 12 the event of the death of a member after providing notice of 13 election but before the date of retirement, the provisions of 14 subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply. All time service 15 credit purchases, whether existing prior to or initiated during 16 the early retirement period, must be completed no later than 17 the date of retirement in order for the service purchased to 18 be included in the member's benefit calculation. 19
  - (d) Any member who elects to retire pursuant to subsections(a) or (b) above shall be prohibited from being re-employed by the City for a period of one year from the date of retirement, except that such member may be re-employed on a part-time or temporary basis pursuant to Sec. 120.209(d). If a member who elects to retire pursuant to subsections (a) or (b) above is re-employed by the City on a full-time basis more than one year after retirement, the member shall be prohibited from becoming an active member of the General Employees Retirement Plan and shall not accrue any additional benefits, service, pensionable compensation, plan amendment or any other benefit from the

General Employees Retirement Plan, and payment of retirement benefits except accrual of COLA benefits shall be suspended for the period of re-employment.

4 (e) In lieu of retirement under the General Employees Retirement
5 Plan, members meeting the age and/or time service credit
6 requirements of subsections (a) or (b) may elect to convert to
7 the GEDC Plan in accordance with section 120.202(e), and shall
8 be subject to all of the terms, requirements, and restrictions
9 of subsections (c) and (d) above.

10 2. JEA Members.

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- Notwithstanding any other provision in this Part II to the 11 (a) contrary, a JEA member may retire between May 1, 2021, and 12 October 31, 2021, if on the date of such retirement the member 13 has attained: (1) age 55 with 10 years of credited service, or 14 (2) age 60 with 5 years of credited service. A member who 15 retires pursuant to this subsection (a) must retire between 16 May 1, 2021 and October 31, 2021 and shall receive a benefit 17 of 2.5 percent per year of credited service based on final 18 monthly compensation and credited service, defined by Sections 19 20 120.201 (i) and (n), as of the date of termination.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision in this Part II to the 21 22 contrary, early retirement shall be available to a JEA member 23 between May 1, 2021, and October 31, 2021, if on the date of 24 early retirement the member has completed 20 or more years of 25 credited service, but less than 30 years of credited service, 26 regardless of age. A member who retires pursuant to this subsection (b) must retire between May 1, 2021 and October 31, 27 28 2021 and shall receive a benefit of two percent per year of 29 credited service, based on final monthly compensation and 30 credited service, defined by Sections 120.201 (i) and (n), as

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of the date of termination.

- 2 To be eligible for retirement under subsections (a) or (b) (C) 3 above, in addition to meeting the age and/or time service credit requirements, a member must submit written or electronic 4 notice of the retirement election and the date of retirement 5 to the Board between May 1, 2021 and June 30, 2021. 6 Such 7 election shall be binding on the member and irrevocable. In the event of the death of a member after providing notice of 8 9 election but before the date of retirement, the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply. All time service 10 credit purchases, whether existing prior to or initiated during 11 the early retirement period, must be completed no later than 12 the date of retirement in order for the service purchased to 13 be included in the member's benefit calculation. 14
- Any member who elects to retire pursuant to subsections (a) or 15 (d) (b) above shall be prohibited from being re-employed by the 16 City for a period of one year from the date of retirement, 17 except that such member may be re-employed on a part-time or 18 temporary basis pursuant to Sec. 120.209(d). If a member who 19 20 elects to retire pursuant to subsections (a) or (b) above is re-employed by the City on a full-time basis more than one year 21 after retirement, the member shall be prohibited from becoming 22 23 an active member of the General Employees Retirement Plan and 24 shall not accrue any additional benefits, service, pensionable 25 compensation, plan amendment or any other benefit from the 26 General Employees Retirement Plan, and payment of retirement benefits except accrual of COLA benefits shall be suspended 27 28 for the period of re-employment.
- (e) In lieu of retirement under the General Employees Retirement
   Plan, members meeting the age and/or time service credit

requirements of subsections (a) or (b) may elect to convert to the GEDC Plan in accordance with section 120.202(e), and shall be subject to all of the terms, requirements, and restrictions of subsections (c) and (d) above.

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5 Section 2. Codification Instructions. The Codifier and the 6 Office of General Counsel are authorized to make all chapter and 7 division "tables of contents" consistent with the changes set forth 8 herein. Such editorial changes and any others necessary to make the 9 Ordinance Code consistent with the intent of this legislation are 10 approved and directed herein, and changes to the Ordinance Code shall 11 be made forthwith and when inconsistencies are discovered.

12 Section 3. Requirement of Actuarial Report to be filed with the State Division of Retirement before final reading and adoption 13 14 of legislation. Pursuant to Section 112.63(3), Florida Statutes, and Chapter 120 (General Employees and Corrections Officer Pension Plans 15 and all Employees Defined Contribution Retirement Plans), Part I 16 (Provisions Applicable to the System as a Whole), Section 120.102 17 (Administration of the Retirement System), subsection (v), Ordinance 18 Code, the City must have prepared and file an actuarial report with 19 20 the State Division of Retirement before final reading and adoption 21 of this Ordinance.

Section 4. JEA Collective Bargaining. As required, the JEA
 will collectively bargain with unions representing covered bargaining
 unit employees of JEA.

25 Section 5. City Unions and Jacksonville Housing Authority 26 Collective Bargaining. The City has collectively bargained with 27 unions representing covered bargaining unit employees of City. Copies 28 of the Memorandum of Understandings with the City Unions and 29 Jacksonville Housing Authority with which the City has collectively 30 bargained are On File with the Legislative Services Division.

1 Section 6. Exception to prerequisite. Pursuant to Sec. 2 106.108 (c) and (d), this ordinance hereby excepts the prerequisite 3 requiring the plan to be at least 90 percent actuarially funded at 4 the time of approval of legislation affecting pension benefits. This 5 exception was initiated by the Mayor and requires approval by two-6 thirds vote of all City Council Members.

7 Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 8 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 9 without the Mayor's signature.

As requested, we have reviewed the updated proposed Ordinance 2020-529, which creates Section 120.216 of the City of Jacksonville Ordinance Code. The updated proposed ordinance would temporarily allow for accelerated retirement eligibility for all participants of the General Employees Retirement Plan. Attached is the impact on the General Employees Retirement Plan as a result of the proposed ordinance, assuming a) a 100% take rate; b) a 50% take rate; and c) a 25% take rate.

Based on pension service start dates and dates of birth reported for the October 1, 2019 actuarial valuation, we have determined that 780 participants are eligible for earlier retirement eligibility under the proposed ordinance 2020-529. Our calculations do not take into account any service purchases or other data changes not reported to us at that time.

Unless otherwise stated, all assumptions are the same as those used in the October 1, 2019 actuarial valuation. The work herein was completed under my supervision, and I meet the Qualification Standards of the American Academy of Actuaries to render the actuarial opinions contained herein.

# City of Jacksonville General Employees Retirement Plan

## Actuarial Impact Statement

Ordinance 2020-529 proposes Section 120.216, "2021 Limited Retirement Option", of the City of Jacksonville Ordinances, be created to allow the following plan changes to occur to the City of Jacksonville General Employees Retirement Plan ("GERP") during an early retirement window period.

- Normal retirement eligibility at either age 60 with 5 years of credited service or age 55 with 10 years of service.
- Early retirement eligibility at any age with 20 years of service, based on a 2.0% benefit multiplier.

In conjunction with the changes above, the following adjustments to the assumptions have been made:

- The early retirement window period for purposes of the Impact Statement is April 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021 for all non-JEA participants and May 1, 2021 through October 31, 2021 for all JEA participants.
- Early retirement eligibility has been determined as of September 30, 2021 (October 31, 2021 for JEA).
- The 100% take rate scenario assumes that anyone who obtains retirement eligibility under the provisions herein and who would not have otherwise been eligible for retirement retires immediately.
- Retirement rates have not been changed to assume immediate retirement if a participant is scheduled to achieve eligibility for normal retirement under the current GERP provisions.
- Participants who are scheduled to achieve eligibility for normal retirement under the current GERP provisions are not included in the early retirement window participant headcount.
- Normal Cost and expected employee contributions for participants assumed to retire under the enhanced eligibility provisions has been set to zero.
- It is assumed that members who may become retirement eligible under different options will choose the option most valuable to them.
