

The Florida-Friendly Landscaping (FFL) Program wants to properly train you on capturing rain water in this evening Rain Barrel workshop, Friday, November 21, 5:45 - 6:45pm at the Extension Office.

By collecting and storing rainwater, you can save money, improve the health of your plants, and protect the environment. Rain barrels provide the Florida homeowner with over 50 gallons of free water for their landscape each time it fills up. You can connect additional rain barrels or install an underground cistern to store even more. In addition to saving homeowners

#### **Duval County PBC Facts**

- In 2024, 2,031 pounds and 1,577 jars were collected
- In 2023, 1,541 pounds and 1,081 jars were collected
- In 2022, 749 pounds and 571 jars were collected
- In 2024, peanut butter was dropped off to 11 local food pantries, up 2 from prior year
- In the statewide challenge, Duval County was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the NE District and 5<sup>th</sup> in the state out of 50 participating counties





#### **Goals**

- Increase pounds collected by 25% to 2.5k pounds
- Increase number of food pantries by 10% to 12
- Increase participation of groups, organizations, clubs


