As a result of fee and contract negotiations with Humana, we recommend that the City enter into a contract with Humana for the City of Jacksonville Group Dental Insurance Plan. Humana has agreed to the following:

- 1. Increase the rate guarantee to 36 months and reduce the rate cap to 7% in year 5.
- 2. Recruit the top 100 nonparticipating providers.
- 3. Commit to sending a monthly claims feed, free of charge, to the City's flexible spending provider.

The contract shall begin on January 1, 2022 for an initial three-year period and will include renewal options for two additional one-year periods ending on December 31st of each year.

All other terms and conditions are according to the Scope of Services outlined in the Request for Proposal. The maximum indebtedness shall not exceed \$7,000,000 for the initial contract period.

Good morning. In follow up to our discussions, I wanted to provide Humana's response. We are looking forward to working with you on the implementation of the dental. Humana has agreed to your requests. The items you asked for are listed below and I have attached several documents as a part of my response. I am available today to review and discuss the below items.

- Offer a 36 month guarantee with a 4th year cap of 6% and 5th year cap of 7%-Agreed (see attached rate exhibit)
- Substantiate all codes that were blank on Humana DHMO analysis- Every year Humana evaluates all claims codes processed from actual utilization on PPO plans. Once this evaluation is done the CDT core team works with clinical on the addition of new codes and adding them to the plans. While DHMO plans in general are typically leaner than DPPO plans, most claims will be covered under the codes listed on the DHMO schedule provided. The best example of this is the past year we analyzed 5 million claims and determined that 98.6% were covered under the DHMO schedule. Also, Humana is adding a number of codes not on the current plan offered today. For example, on perio maintenance that we do not have a frequency limitation. Finally, some codes are obsolete and others we do not cover the DHMO for clinical reasons to protect the member. I have prepared 2 separate documents to share with you. One is an updated schedule of Codes with the new codes Humana added and further clarification. The other document is from Dr. Fry's team that gives a list of explanation on why some of these codes are not covered under Humana's DHMO plans.
- Begin recruiting top 100 non par providers immediately. Confirmed. Please approve letter template (see attached) and the use of the City's name/logo. We would also like to schedule a 30 minute call to review the data provided from the incumbent.

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 Commit to sending a claims feed to Discovery FSA to help members substantiate claims – Confirmed. The database that we use to do this reporting is updated once a month (we schedule our feeds after the 5th of the month as this update is occurring until then). The database is an update of the previous months activity. We are also able to schedule it for the 5th or the 10th or even the 15th of the month based on the City's preference.







The subcommittee received Seven (7) proposals for evaluation for the subject project. All were found to be responsive, interested, qualified and available to provide the services required by the RFP.

The proposals were evaluated using the criteria outlined in the Purchasing Code as augmented by the RFP (see attached matrix).

Based on the above, the following firms listed alphabetically were determined to be the most qualified of those submitting proposals. The ranking of first, second and third designates the order of qualification of these firms to perform the required services.

- 2. TTV Architects, Inc.

Based on Section 11 of the RFP, the three top-ranked proposals will be provided criteria and scheduling information for Oral Interviews, which will have an additional value of 20 points which will be added to the score from the evaluation of the Contractor's proposal. Final Ranking of the top three firms will be based on the combination of scores from the proposal evaluations and oral Interviews. We anticipate needing thirty minutes for each presentation.

Accordingly, we request your approval to schedule the oral Interviews for P-31-20 Professional Architectural Services for Oceanway/New Berlin Library.

SCOPE OF SERVICES SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 2 May 12, 2021

PROFESSIONAL DESIGN SERVICES FOR ARMSDALE ROAD SIDEWALK AND ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS CONTRACT NO. 10479 CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA

A. BACKGROUND

The Consultant (Peters and Yaffee, Inc.) was originally retained by the City of Jacksonville (COJ) under Contract No. 10479 for the Engineering Design Phase for Armsdale Road Sidewalk and Roadway Improvements. The Notice to Proceed was dated October 9, 2018.

B. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Scope of Services (Supplemental Agreement No. 2) is to provide authorization for supplemental services to the above described Contract related to the roadway and drainage design, signing and pavement marking design, signalization design, lighting design, specification package preparation and permitting with the St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) and the Army Corps of Engineers (ACOE).

C. SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED

The services under this agreement are intended to provide supplemental services in addition to the services included in the original Scope of Services dated July 5, 2018 and the subsequent contract amendment dated November 6, 2019. The supplemental services are:

1. Specifications Package Preparation

The Consultant will update the Specifications Package to incorporate the recent changes to Section 31 and to add necessary information for the new signal installation.

2. Roadway and Drainage Analysis and Plans

The Consultant will review the updated lighting design to determine if updates are necessary to the roadway plans to avoid conflicts with proposed light pole locations. This effort will also include updating the roadway design to avoid identified conflicts.

The Consultant will update the roadway and drainage design for the addition of a northbound left turn lane and a southbound left turn lane at the intersection of Armsdale Road and Duval Road. Total length of turn lane improvements is estimated to be 1500'.

3. Environmental Permitting

The Consultant will prepare and submit for a Permit Exemption Request Letter for addition of new turn lanes from SJRWMD and respond to any comments.

4. Signing and Pavement Marking Analysis and Plans

The Consultant will revise the existing signing and pavement marking design to include the addition of northbound and southbound left turn lanes on Duval Road at the intersection with Armsdale Road.

5. Signalization Analysis and Plans

The Consultant will develop and include a new box span signalization design for a new traffic signal at the intersection of Armsdale Road and Duval Road.

6. Structural Analysis and Plans

STV will provide structural design services for a box span at the Armsdale Road North/Duval Road intersection. STV will check vertical clearances; perform structural design of the box span, pole, and foundations using the FDOT ATLAS design program; and provide construction plans consisting of concrete span wire data tables (standard and/or special design as applicable). Information to be provided by others includes, but is not limited to, geotechnical design parameters; sign and signal sizes and locations; pole configurations, and survey information.

7. Lighting Design Analysis and Plans

The Consultant will revise the existing lighting design to meet City of Jacksonville Collector Road criteria requirements. A lighting design and plans will be provided for the Armsdale Road/Duval Road intersection.

8. Geotechnical

Perform three SPT borings to depths of 30 feet below existing ground surface at the proposed signalization structures at the Duval Road/Armsdale Road intersection.

Underground utility locates will be identified through the Sunshine One-Call System. Private utilities not registered with the system, such as irrigation systems, will need to be located by the Owner.

Laboratory classification and index property tests will be performed as necessary on selected soil samples obtained from the exploration.

The results of the exploration and engineering evaluation will then be documented in a report containing the following:

A brief discussion of our understanding of the planned construction and imposed loading conditions.

A presentation of the field and laboratory test procedures used and the data obtained.

A presentation of the existing on-site conditions, such as topography, surface vegetation, etc. as they relate to the planned construction.

A presentation of the encountered subsurface conditions, including subsurface profiles and measured groundwater levels, estimated seasonal high groundwater levels, and estimated geotechnical engineering properties (as necessary).

Recommended soil parameters for foundation design of the signalization structures.

9. Subsurface Utility Engineering

Perform exploratory excavations at proposed signal pole locations to provide Quality Level A SUE information on all utility conflicts and establish a cleared area for signal pole design. A total of four (4) exploratory excavations will be provided (one in each quadrant of the Armsdale Road/Duval Road Intersection).

10. Design Survey

The Consultant will prepare the required drawings and legal descriptions for a new 20' wide drainage easement that will be acquired north of existing Right of Way of Armsdale Road at the cross drain located at Station 79+50. The Consultant will also prepare drawings and legal descriptions for 28 Temporary Construction Easements of varying widths for the project.

D. CONSULTANT RESPONSIBILITIES

All services and requirements as outlined in the original Contract No. 10479, including any Supplemental Amendments, shall remain in full force and effect.

E. CITY OF JACKSONVILLE'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The COJ's responsibilities shall remain the same as in the original Contract No. 10479, including any Supplemental Amendments.

F. NOTICE TO PROCEED

No work on this project will be performed until a fully executed Contract Amendment and Notice to Proceed has been issued by COJ authorizing Consultant to initiate execution of this Supplemental Agreement No. 2.

The Department of Public Works received only two (2) proposals for the RFP solicitation for the Referenced RFP. Per Section 126.302(f) of the Procurement Code if:

"PSEC receives responses from less than three proposers, it shall re-solicit proposals from proposers previously solicited and from additional persons, unless it determines, in writing, that no advantage would be obtained by re-soliciting. Notwithstanding the number of responses received, PSEC may proceed to consider those proposers responding to the re-solicitation or to the initial solicitation if it determines, in writing, that no advantage would be obtained by re-soliciting."

Only three firms attended the pre-proposal meeting with only 2 responding, the 3rd will be a sub consultant to one of the respondents. Since this is a specialty discipline, the Department of Public Works does not have employees with the necessary expertise. The City has, in the past, hired a Consultant to provide these services. The RFP was advertised for 37 days and was downloaded by 38 firms. We feel that this time afforded ample time for consulting firms to become aware of the RFP and prepare/submit responses. Additionally, we believe that we have received proposals from qualified firms.

Considering the foregoing information, staff requests permission to review and grade the proposal received.

AMENDMENT NO. 8 COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM UPDATE

This Authorization, when executed, shall be incorporated in and become part of the Agreement for Professional Services between the City of Jacksonville (CITY), and CDM Smith Inc. (ENGINEER), dated June 23, 2017 hereafter referred to as the Contract.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The CITY conducted a major update to their 1992 Master Stormwater Management Plan (MSMP) in 2011 and updated the tributary stormwater models in 2013. Since that time, the CITY has continued to develop and implement capital improvement projects. The 1992 and 2011 MSMP documents considered combined rainfall and tidal flooding to most accurately define flooding and solutions. The current contract includes services related to update, refinement, and maintenance of the CITY's MSMP.

Since the 2013 update, the CITY has provided support to Jacksonville consultants, contractors, developers, and surveyors by distributing MSMP information and providing interpretation of MSMP data. As the CITY's Stormwater consultant, ENGINEER has become the keeper of this data and routinely provides access to the data as directed by the CITY.

Original Contract—The contract included development of a design criteria package and a grant application for the Doeboy Regional Stormwater Facility.

Amendment No. 1 – Amendment No. 1 includes preliminary design services related to development of stormwater treatment facilities for the Arlington area. The amendment includes modifying the existing stormwater model to include the proposed facility, quantifying water quality and quantity impacts, and preparing a cost estimate.

Amendment No. 2 – Amendment No. 2 includes services to maintain the MSMP data sets and models and distribute them to third parties at the CITY's direction on an as-requested basis.

Amendment No. 3 - Amendment No. 3 extended the contract timeline to June 21, 2021

Amendment No. 4 – Amendment No. 4 includes support for the City Community Rating System (CRS) 5-year audit and recertification.

Amendment No. 5 – Amendment No. 5 includes services to provide SWMM modeling services and interpretation of results in response to requests from the CITY for alternative analysis.



Amendment No. 6 – Amendment No. 6 revalidates the stormwater utility rate and documents the methodology in a technical memorandum.

Amendment No.7 – Amendment No. 7 reviews the countywide list of MSMP projects and updates project information based on 1) re-prioritization of the CITY's level of service goals for flood control, water quality, and operation and maintenance, 2) updates estimated project costs based on CPI index, 3) determines ability of the proposed project to be implemented based on current land availability.

Amendment No. 8 – Amendment No. 8 supports the 2021 annual recertification submittal for the Community Rating System (CRS), including a review of changes per the 2017 CRS Coordinator's annual and subsequent Addendum.

TASK 5 - AS-NEEDED ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR MSMP MODELING QUERIES

There is no change to this task.

TASK 7 - MASTER STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN UPDATE 2021

TASK 8 – COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM EVALUATION

TASK 8.1 – KICKOFF MEETING

CONSULTANT will hold a kickoff meeting with CITY Staff to review the scope of work and determine the documentation and data gaps needed to complete the task.

TASK 8.2 – REEVALUATE COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM FOR THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

CONSULTANT will hire a SUBCONSULTANT to perform the following tasks:

- Review Elevation Certificates for new and Substantial Improvement/Substantial Damage Repair structures for completeness and accuracy. Prepare/coordinate corrections to Elevation Certificates as needed.
- 2. Review and organize all documentation being submitted for CRS Program Annual Recertification.
- 3. Coordinate with team members to finalize/complete the documentation needed for the Annual Recertification package.
- 4. Participate with the team (City staff and CDM Smith staff) for any visits or conference calls with the Insurance Services Office (ISO), or Federal Emergency Management Assistance (FEMA).

CONSULTANT will provide support to the subcontractor in contacting CITY staff and providing access to files developed as part of the five year certification process performed in 2019-2020.

Deliverable: Electronic submittals to satisfy the requirements of the annual recertification process in electronic (*.pdf) format.

TASK 8.3- PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Activities performed under this task consist of those general functions required to maintain the project on schedule, within budget, and that the quality of the work products defined within this scope is consistent with CONSULTANT's standards and OWNER's expectations. Specific activities include project quality review of deliverables, periodic progress meetings (up to three meetings budgeted), and general administration of the contract.

BASIS OF ESTIMATE

The following have been used to develop this Amendment and the associated budget:

- CITY shall provide access to development services information including elevation certificates and the elevation certificate log (all elevation certificates for completed construction with structures within the special flood hazard area).
- CITY shall coordinate with other departments as necessary to obtain supporting documentation related to CITY-conducted activities needed for the recertification.
- If CITY was not able to conduct the necessary activities, CONSULTANT will advise CITY of remedial action to bring CRS program back into compliance and may assist in conducting activities time allows. There is no guarantee that CONSULTANT will be able to conduct the necessary activities on behalf of the CITY within the time available.
- CITY will conduct all communication with the ISO office and will submit all provided documents to ISO to comply with the annual recertification.

TIME OF COMPLETION/SCHEDULE

It is anticipated that the work in Task 8 will take 60 days to complete, starting within two weeks of receipt of a formal notice to proceed (NTP), excluding review of the elevation certificates. Review of elevation certificates will be conducted on the schedule established by ISO following submittal of the elevation certificate log. CONSULTANT will prepare an updated detailed schedule within the first 14 calendar days after NTP.

COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT

Compensation for work described in Task 8 will be completed on a not-to-exceed basis. The not-to-exceed amount of this Amendment is \$42,641.58 as shown in Exhibit N. Invoices will be submitted monthly based on the hours incurred and the average hourly direct labor rate for the category of the individual performing the work plus the approved overhead multiplier and profit rates for all time directly chargeable to the project, as shown in Attachment 1.

The new grand total amount of this contract is \$507,314.
