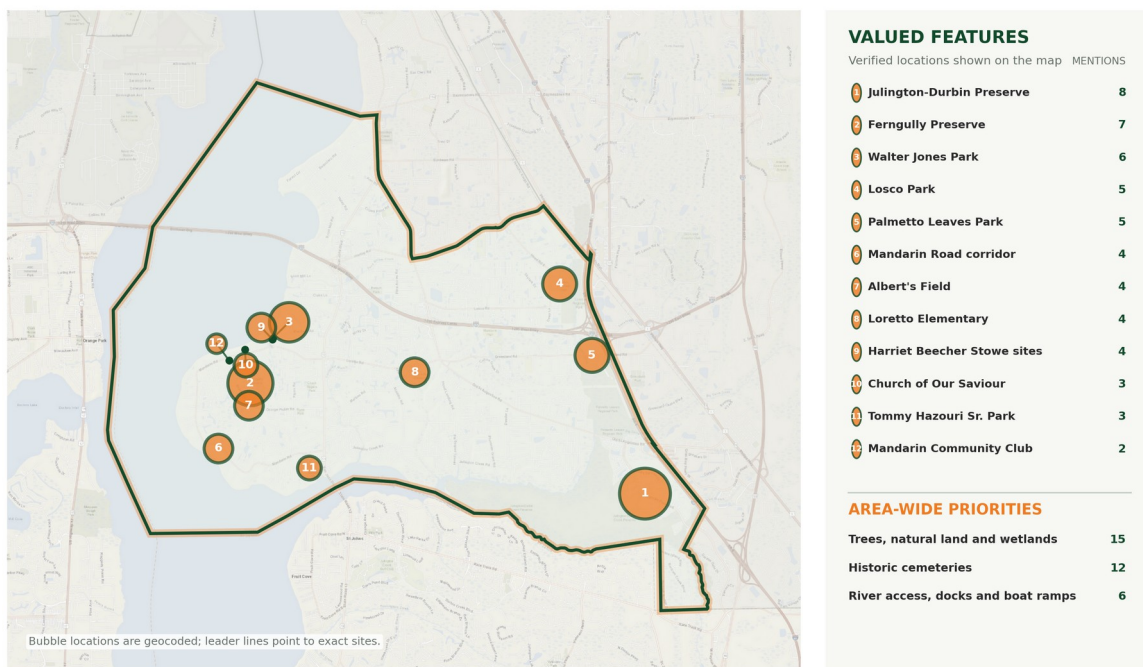

PRIMARY BOUNDARY FINDING

Participants support including the complete City Council District 6 footprint in the preservation area.

What Participants Identified

The workshop produced 176 recorded responses: 139 feature responses and 37 boundary responses. Repeated mentions are retained because frequency helps show where community priorities converged.

Boundary Input and Interpretation

COMMUNITY DIRECTION

Use the full official District 6 boundary as the preservation-area frame. The named feature locations shown on the map all fall within that boundary.

Boundary Areas Mentioned

Participants referred to the following neighborhoods and areas when discussing the preferred preservation boundary. Together, the responses point to a district-wide frame rather than a smaller subarea.

How to Use These Results

Preservation framework: Use the full District 6 footprint as the geographic frame for subsequent MAPP analysis and engagement.

Resource focus: Carry the repeatedly named parks, preserves, historic sites, corridors, cemeteries, natural lands, and river-access locations into the next phase.

Public record: Retain the complete source tables as the verbatim workshop record; use this companion and the visual map as the public-facing synthesis.

Sources and Method

Response counts were consolidated from the Workshop No. 1 map-response tables. Named feature locations were verified using ArcGIS geocoding and plotted against the current City of Jacksonville JaxGIS Council District 6 geometry. Repeated responses were retained in the frequency totals.
