The month of May was chosen to commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese to the United States on May 7, 1843, and to mark the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869, whose

Asian-American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in Jacksonville for more than a decade, joining others across the nation in recognizing the valuable contributions of these citizens and communities. This
