WHEREAS: More than 90 percent of Florida's drinking water is supplied by underlying aquifers, and our quality of life and economy depend upon that includes a reliable, clean, and available supply of water; and

WHEREAS: The State of Florida, the St. Johns River Water Management District, and the City of Jacksonville are working together to increase awareness about the importance of water conservation and enhance efforts to save water; and




