ONE CITY. ONE JACKSONVILLE.

WHEREAS: Firefighters and emergency medical services personnel play an essential role in safeguarding the lives and property of citizens throughout our city, state, and nation; and

WHEREAS: The approximately 1,600 firefighters and emergency medical first responders of the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD) provide services to over 900,000 people across Jacksonville's 840 square miles in a constant effort to reduce deaths, injuries, and property loss; and

WHEREAS: Firefighting is one of the most hazardous of all professions, demanding extensive training, strength and stamina, bravery, and selfless concern for the safety and well-being of others in the face of possible injury and even death; and


