in 1993; and

**WHEREAS:** Starting off, CAP offered one dance class to 10 children. With the

mission of instilling creative thinking and lifelong social-emotional learning skills in Jacksonville youth, CAP has grown to serve over

31,000 students in Duval County; and

WHEREAS: On average, CAP students score 7 points higher on standardized

tests, achieve higher grade proficiency, perform better in science, and receive half as many behavioral violations in comparison to students

not involved in the program; and

WHEREAS: In 2013, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts selected

Jacksonville as its 14<sup>th</sup> Any Given Child (AGC) Community. Only 27 AGC designations have been awarded in the United States, and ensures that all K-8 students in Duval County receive equitable access

to an arts education; and

**WHEREAS:** For the last three decades, CAP has supported and grown the arts

community in Jacksonville. CAP has positively impacted the lives of generations of Jacksonville's youth through education in the arts; and

**WHEREAS:** The City of Jacksonville joins in honoring the impact and legacy of the

Cathedral Arts Project.
