**WHEREAS:** Jacksonville is a proud military city that honors the service and sacrifice of our nation's military service members and veterans, who contribute to the safety, security and betterment of our nation; and

**WHEREAS:** This year marks the 61<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the Vietnam War, in which more than 58,000 military service members lost their lives, thousands more were wounded, and 1,600 remain missing in action; and

**WHEREAS:** More than 519,000 Vietnam-era veterans call Florida their home, and over 1,100 reside in Duval County; and

**WHEREAS:** Vietnam veterans provide great contributions to our communities and are exemplary leaders representing valuable skills, education, and dedication gained during their military service; and

**WHEREAS:** Since the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Vietnam War in 2012, March 29 is observed throughout the country as National Vietnam War Veterans Day, recognizing veterans who served during the Vietnam War.


