ONE CITY. ONE JACKSONVILLE.

WHEREAS: Law enforcement agencies across the country, including members of the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office (JSO), play an essential role in promoting and safeguarding the rights and freedoms of American citizens; and

WHEREAS: It is important that citizens know and understand local law enforcement professionals' responsibilities, hazards and sacrifices; and

WHEREAS: Members of JSO recognize the risks of their sworn duty to serve the citizens of Jacksonville by safeguarding lives and property, protecting against violence and disorder, and preventing deception and oppression; and

WHEREAS: In 1962, President John F. Kennedy designated May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day, and the week surrounding as National Police Week, which has grown into an annual series of events that draw thousands to the nation's capital; and

WHEREAS: In conjunction with the annual Peace Officers Memorial Day, and in tribute to the 64 fallen officers who have made the ultimate sacrifice in service to our city, the Jacksonville community and the Jacksonville Sheriff's office honor the men and women who selflessly provide this significant public service.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim May 14 – 20, 2023 as

POLICE APPRECIATION WEEK


and hereby designate April 3, 2023 as
