



PROCLAMATION

ONE CITY. ONE JACKSONVILLE.

WHEREAS: The Philippine Archipelago was colonized by the Spanish at the end of the 16th century and a rebellion took root in 1892 with the formation of a secret revolutionary society. On June 12, 1898, Filipino rebels, led by Emilio Aguinaldo, declared independence during the Spanish-American War; and

WHEREAS: Another figure during this time, Dr. José Rizal, wrote critically of the Spanish elite and was executed on December 30, 1896, after being convicted of rebellion, sedition, and conspiracy. He is now upheld as a national hero among Filipinos, honored both on his birthday, June 19, and the date of his death; and

WHEREAS: Aguinaldo's assistance to the United States during the war helped lead to his country's liberation and build a relationship of support between the United States and the Philippines that has continued ever since, including during the Pacific battles of World War II; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville is home to Florida's largest population of Filipino Americans, who also make up the largest immigrant population in Northeast Florida, and greatly contribute to the multifaceted fabric of our society, culture, and economy while serving our community as both as local taxpayers and consumers; and

WHEREAS: Today in Jacksonville, over 20,000 active and retired military service men and women, nurses, medical professionals, teachers, lawyers, and other Filipino Americans have adopted the City of Jacksonville their home away from home.


