- Executive summary & Introduction
 - The report is 75 pages and includes all committees.
 - Infrastructure will be 16 total with all subcommittees.
 - Identify recommendations and sentences. Expect duplicate recommendations from multiple committees.
 - Vote as a full infrastructure committee.

- Changes
 - Pg. 3: above recommendations, add need to address riverfront access.
 - Pg. 2: change verbiage adjacent not substantial. Decision was to take out adjacent.

- Major points -pg. 5
 - Place numbers
 - # 8 take out the following. Just say concerning the riverfront.
 - 2nd bullet: significant amount of publicly owned land.
 - Last bullet: change plans not implemented to not fully come to fruition.
 - Say public skepticism due to lack of significant measurable progress.

- Opportunities-pg. 6
 - Add consensus to downtown momentum.
 - Add "to" complete parks....

- Challenges
 - 4th bullet is redundant.
 - Difficulty creating a cohesive and iconic downtown riverfront.
 - Last bullet-change verbiage to climate change that causes extreme weather events, excessive heat and sea level rise creates health, environmental, and resilience issues.
