THE LAW: ARTICLE 22

#### **Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees**

#### Section 22.01

#### Creation

There is hereby created and established a body politic and corporate to be known as the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension board of Trustees, which is hereby authorized to exercise its jurisdiction, powers, and duties within the territorial limits of Duval County.

#### Section 22.04.

General Powers

The Board shall have the power to:

\*\*\*

- (c) Sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, and complain and defend in all courts.
  - (d) Enter into contracts, leases, or other transactions.

#### **Section 22.07.**

# Amendatory power

- (a) The Board of Trustees shall have the sole and exclusive responsibility of administering the pension plan, but nothing herein shall empower the Board to amend the provisions of the pension plan without the approval of the Jacksonville City Council.
- (b) No legislation shall be adopted by the Jacksonville City Council altering the terms of the pension fund without said legislation having first been referred to the Board for its consideration and comment. The Board may, as it deems necessary, recommend legislative changes and pass those recommendations on to the Jacksonville City Council for their consideration

as ordinances.

(c) The benefit plan administered by the Board shall be as established by ordinance or charter provision, or by special act or general law of the Legislature, which shall be incorporated in this article by reference.

#### Section 22.08.

Applicability of state law

The Board shall be bound in its actions by the provisions of:

- (a) Chapter 185, Florida Statutes, as amended.
- (b) Chapter 175, Florida Statutes, as amended.
- (c) Section 14, Article X of the State Constitution.

#### **Section 22.10.**

### Declaration of purposes

The Board created by this article and the purposes for which it is intended to serve are hereby found to be for a public purpose. The Board shall be considered a governmental unit responsible for the management of an irrevocable trust as that term is used in s. 112.66(8), Florida Statutes.

# RESTATED AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND THE JACKSONVILLE POLICE AND FIRE PENSION BOARD OF TRUSTEES

28. <u>Cooperation</u>. The parties agree to make available to each other on a continuing basis, all information that is necessary to insure the success of this Agreement and to avoid the creation of any further disputes, to execute any and all documents necessary to fulfill the terms of this Agreement, and to work harmoniously to enforce the provisions of this Agreement, and all pension ordinances and statutes, and to avoid obstruction of either party's rights under the law or this Agreement. The parties further agree to harmoniously recodify existing police and fire pension ordinances consistent with the intent of this Agreement and existing practice.

Both the City and the Board hereby covenant and agree that they shall neither take any action nor fail to take any action, nor, to the extent that they may do so, permit any person to take any action which, if either taken or not taken, would adversely affect the terms of this Agreement. (Page 22)

- 31. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall have a term extending to September 30, 2030. If for any reason the term shall be challenged as a matter of law, the term of this Agreement shall not be less than the minimum term allowed by law. The terms of this Agreement shall control beyond the expressed term hereof until such time as either party is notified in writing by certified mail, return receipt requested as to its intention to terminate. - 32. The City and the Board of Trustees of the Police and Fire Pension Fund shall meet no later than January 1, 2005, and periodically thereafter to review the provisions of this Agreement, which either party wishes to address. Such future discussion shall be guided by a mutual desire to ensure the continued application of terms and conditions that are fair and equitable given circumstances that may present themselves in the future that are not currently addressed nor presently anticipated by the parties hereto upon execution of this Restated Agreement. It is intended that each UAAL base be amortized over its specified period from April 1, 2000, through monthly contributions expressed as a level percentage of each month's payroll, incorporating an assumption that future payroll will grow at the rate of 5.25% per year. Payments are assumed to begin on April 1, 2000, and continue monthly for the remaining period unless offset as provided above.

Asset Valuation Method: Fresh start as of April 1, 2000. Asset Values used for purposes of the Actuarial Valuation performed as of April 1, 2000, were based upon actual market values as of March 31, 2000. Future Asset Valuations will be determined in accordance with the multi-year smoothing methodology.

Note: Methods of valuing assets and actuarial cost methods are also defined for purposes of this Agreement as actuarial assumptions.



WHEREAS, Ordinance 2003-573-E enacted by the City Council on June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2003, provided an increased pension supplement for certain retirees and beneficiaries of the City of Jacksonville effective with the first full biweekly pay period after October 1, 2003; and

WHEREAS, retirees of the Police and Fire Pension Plan were not included in the legislation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Restated Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and the Jacksonville Police and Fire Pension Board of Trustees dated March 5, 2001, as amended by the First Amendment dated May 21, 2003, and as approved by Ordinances 2000-1164-E and 2003-303-E, respectively, the City agreed that effective April 1, 2000, the COLA described in section 121.201(d), Ordinance Code, was an immediate benefit and was fixed at three percent; consequently, Police and Fire retirees no longer had to wait the five year period required by the current version of section 121.201(d)(1) before receiving the COLA; now therefore,

The parties recognize the City's interest in obtaining various forms of actuarial and other financial data that would allow the City to properly assess the financial and actuarial condition of the Fund, including the calculation of the unfunded actuarial accrued liability, revised required contribution rates and the balance of reserve funds on a timely basis. Such data is generally reflected in the annual GASB reports prepared by the Plan Actuary, the annual independent audit report, and the Acruarial Valuation that is periodically prepared by the Plan Actuary. In addressing the City's need for timely information, the Board commits to the provision of such reports no later than January 15th of the year following the September 30th as of date from such reports. For reports covering the period ending September 30, 2003, the due date of such reports shall be April 1, 2004.

WHEREAS, one of the programs of Enhanced Benefits which utilizes funding from Chapter Funds is represented by the
